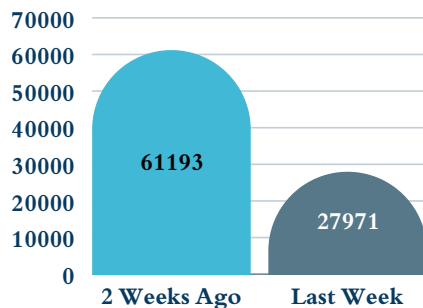

Pastor's Corner



January 11, 2026
The Baptism of the Lord

My Dear People of God!

Today, the Church celebrates the Baptism of the Lord Jesus by Saint John the Baptist. This day simultaneously marks the end of the Christmas Season and the beginning of what we call Ordinary Time. The reason why it does is that at His Baptism, Christ began His public ministry which would lead to His arrest, crucifixion, Death, and Resurrection. Baptism is the beginning of the life of grace in each of us as well.

Let us therefore take a moment today to reflect on our own baptism and give thanks to God for including us in His family through baptism.

Since grace is necessary for holiness, it is good to reflect on the second mark of the Church today: the Church is holy. The Church's holiness has to do with her origin and her destination. She is holy because she is founded by Christ and is, as Saint Paul will say throughout his letters, His Body. She is holy as she imitates the Lord in His works always directing her love toward the highest good. Her holiness is not based on the holiness of her individual members.

Although holiness is offered to each member of the Church especially through the Sacraments, we know through our own experience that we do not always respond to grace. Instead, we choose our own way. This is what we call sin. When we act in discord with this holiness, we act against this mark of the Church. This is often a scandal for those who do not believe in Christ. This scandal has also caused people to leave the practice of the Church and abandon Christ. We should always strive to the highest call of holiness.

To heal us of this, we need reconciliation with the Church, others, our very self, and the world. This is the other side of holiness in which we can participate. To strive for reconciliation especially with those who have left the Church's practice. Honestly, many times people leave because of the personal sins of others. We need only think of the horror of the sex abuse that was present in the Church or people saying that someone was rude to them when they were in need especially when they were vulnerable like a death in the family. These are very serious wounds that must be tended.

Our duty at Christians then is to fulfill the command that Saint Paul gives to the early Church of reconciling the world to Christ. This takes time and patience. Many times we will need to apologize for those things that we did not personally do. But if we are convinced that Jesus Christ is the unique savior of the world and that we have all received grace and life from Him, then it is worth the time, effort, and patience.

Let us never tire of working for reconciliation and be quick to forgive others of the faults that wounded us so that we may truly live the mark of holiness that is found in the Church because of her association with Christ.
