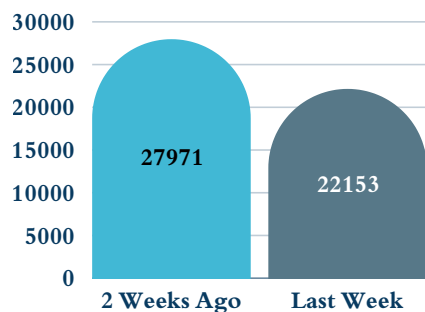

Pastor's Corner



January 18, 2026
2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

My Dear People of God!

We have returned to Ordinary Time which frankly has a bad connotation in our modern English. By Ordinary, the Church means that the Sundays are numbered. However, when we hear the word, we usually think of it as boring and dull. For the Christian, there should never be a boring part of our life when we are living as disciples of our Savior. In this time, it is good to remember that our Lord spent His entire childhood and young adult life in Nazareth at the home of Mary and Joseph. Therefore, in our ordinary time of our life, we can meditate on that reality of daily family life which although is ordinary is far from boring! It is where God has planted us so that we can learn how to be disciples!

As we continue to reflect on the Creed, this week we look at the third mark or characteristic of the Church. We say that the Church is catholic. Notice that we do not capitalize "catholic" in this regard. Remember that there is one Church, the first characteristic or mark of the Church. We use the word "Catholic" today to describe the Church to distinguish it from other Christian denominations and sects. From the beginning of the Church, the early church fathers used the word "catholic" to mean the universal nature of the Church. It literally means "according to the totality;" and the two aspects that the Church sees in regards to her catholic-ness is based on the fact that in union with Christ, He makes each individual Church His own (we have the same sacraments at each Catholic celebration of the sacraments that are the presence of Christ); and the second aspect is that the Church has gone to every culture and people to proclaim the Gospel. (Cf. Catechism of the Catholic Church, 830, 831)

Saint Irenaeus of Lyon who died in the 2nd Century said that the apostles went out fearlessly to each nation to proclaim the truth. In light of this, that single truth of the Pascal Mystery of Jesus Christ and our participation in it makes us everywhere or catholic. This is also why there is a plurality of how people worship in the single truth of the Pascal Mystery. We call these the Rites of the Church. The Eastern Christians' Mass look very different from our Roman Catholic Mass, but the same Lord is made present in the Eucharist. For this purpose, the visible sign according to Saint Irenaeus is our union with the Church (Diocese) of Rome and its Bishop who is the direct descendant in the apostolic line to Saint Peter who was head of the Apostles as appointed by Christ in Matthew 16.

This, of course, is the pope, and today our Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV. If we wonder about authenticity of a movement, we can simply look to see if the person or group is in union with Rome and the Person of the Holy Father. Saint Irenaeus taught this in his work Against the Heresies (Book 3, 3.2) in the year 189!

There is a wonderful universal sense of the Church who embraces all things and through her preaching makes them holy for God. Yet, what joins us in that one profession in Jesus Christ. Let us therefore look around us today and see the diverse group who God has called us to worship with and recognize the union we find in praising and worshipping the one Lord and Savior Jesus Christ!
