From the Desk of Fr. Paul

November 8, 2015

What a hope-filled month we are celebrating! It began with the Solemnity of All Saints and then All Souls' Day. Each year we celebrate the great mystery of what we call "the communion of saints." Simply put, we believe that those who have died in the Lord's friendship are intimately connected to those of us who remain here on earth. When we celebrated All Saints' Day, we recalled the fact that many ordinary people (perhaps among them our own relatives and friends) are already with the Lord in heaven. We're not just talking about formally recognized saints like St. Pio or Saint Faustina, but the countless numbers of ordinary people from every time and place who have gone on before us who either died perfectly in God's friendship or who have already been brought from the purifying experience of purgatory into His kingdom. These saints pray for us and with us to Jesus – they are His intimate friends and from their place in heaven urge us on through all our struggles to live our lives in such a way that we might join them in praising the Holy Trinity for all eternity. Isn't it nice to know that we have a rooting section in heaven for us, especially when we are in great need or dire trouble? "Those who die in God's grace and friendship and are perfectly purified live forever with Christ. They become like God forever, for they see Him as He is 'face to face,'" the Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us.

On All Souls' Day, we remembered all those who have gone before us (among them, some of our own relatives and friends) who died in God's grace and friendship, were not ready just yet for heaven. Although forgiven of past sins, they perhaps did not do enough penance for those sins in this life. They also died with venial sins on their souls. These people are assured of salvation, they are on their way to heaven but need to be cleansed and purified because we cannot enter God's presence with the slightest imperfection. Purgatory is not a static place between heaven and hell but rather a purifying experience for those who are not quite ready to share in the joy of the saints in heaven. So, just what is Purgatory? It is an encounter with the Sacred Heart of Jesus. It is "that burning furnace of charity" which cleanses those who need it. It perfects them, purifies them, and makes them worthy of being with the Lord forever. Is it painful? Yes, because a person encounters such a love as the Lord's and sees oneself with all his imperfections. It is this and the desire to be with Him forever that purifies such a one. But the good news is that those in purgatory are on their way. They benefit from the prayers of the saints and await our prayers for them, especially the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. That is why we have Masses offered for the dead. This practice goes back to the early history of the Church. It is the best way to help those who are in purgatory. We also make sacrifices, pray for them, and gain indulgences for them as well.

You see we are all connected in the one Body of Christ. The saints help the souls in purgatory and us by their prayers to our Divine Lord. The souls in purgatory need our prayers to speedily pass through the cleansing fires of purification and enter into the joy of the Lord. They cannot help themselves but do indeed pray for us.

"From the beginning the Church has honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them so that thus purified they may attain the beatific vision of God." (C.C.C.)

What a great hope we have in the salvation won for us by our Lord Jesus! One day, if we are faithful to Him, we will be together in His kingdom united with the just who have gone before us. So please remember those of your family members and friends who have gone before us; pray for them for perhaps they're not in heaven yet. They never forget you! Have Masses said for them!

And finally, let us remember that God's mercy is tremendous, yet we need only fear one thing: to die unrepentant in mortal sin and to be excluded from God's kingdom forever. May the saints help us to prefer death rather than to commit one mortal sin. Heaven awaits us, the Lord loves us so let us strive to please Him and Him alone!

THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

FIRST READING: 1 KINGS 17:10-16

Elijah convinced the widow to give him water and to make him a cake from her drastically low supplies. She shared, believing that it would be the end of her provisions and that she and her son would starve to death. Instead, her supplies never diminished and the three of them survived the drought and resulting famine.

SECOND READING: HEBREWS 9:24-28

In this reading from the letter to the Hebrews, St. Paul continues to compare the high priest of the Jews with Christ in His role as the High Priest for all of us. Christ's perfect sacrifice leads to our salvation.

GOSPEL: MARK 12:38-44

The theme of today's readings is sacrifice. The second reading focuses on sacrifice in atonement for sins. Similar to the widow in the first reading, the widow in the Gospel is willing to offer what little she has. Christ points out the contrast between the poor widow's gift of all she has with the large gifts of the wealthy who can easily afford to give great sums without it being a truly sacrificial offering.


BAPTISMAL CATECHESIS

Depression Symptoms by Age

Depression symptoms in children and teens are similar to those in adults, although some differences have been observed:

In Younger Children:

- Sadness, irritability, clinginess, worry, aches and pains, refusing to go to school, being underweight.

In Teens:

- Sadness, irritability, feeling negative and worthless, angry, poor performance and or attendance in school, feeling misunderstood and extremely sensitive, using drugs or alcohol, eating or sleeping too much, self-harm, loss of interest in normal activities, and avoidance in social interaction.
- Depression may occur with other mental conditions such as anxiety, eating disorders, substance abuse, and attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder.

In Older Adults:

- Memory difficulties or personality changes, sleep problems, fatigue, loss of appetite, aches, loss of interest in intimacy.
- Often wanting to stay home, rather than socializing or doing new things.
- Suicidal thinking or feelings, especially in older men.
