

From the Desk of Deacon Anthony

Father, the Hour Has Come

May 28, 2017

Soon we will be coming to the end of the Easter Season. This time goes very fast and before we know it, we have completed the 50 days of Easter. The focus of the readings in these final days is on preparing us for relating to our Lord Jesus in a different way after His Ascension and after Pentecost.

Ascension Day's Gospel spoke about Jesus giving His Spirit to His followers and telling them to preach the Good News. It is impossible to preach the Good News in an effective way if one has not received the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit initially comes to each of us in Baptism; and there is a special gift of the Holy Spirit in Confirmation. We can begin to be aware of this presence of the Holy Spirit within us and the Holy Spirit can bring about a very strong conversion in our lives, if we are willing to let the Holy Spirit into our hearts and our beings. This brings us back to the mystery of the Ascension because Jesus tells us in the Gospel that He must go away so that He can send us the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, the Counselor.

Abraham Lincoln won over more people to his cause by his death than he would have had there been no assassination. Begin with Edwin Stanton, his Secretary of War. Stanton had mockingly referred to him as "that giraffe." But immediately after the president's murder, Stanton wept sadly, and said, "There lies the greatest ruler ... the world has ever seen."

Our personal radar should be warning us that today we are walking into awesome country. For this Sunday's Gospel is the only place where the Teacher names Himself as the Christ, "... and the one whom You sent, Jesus Christ." As we listen to Jesus speak to His Father, we may wonder if we are listening to a conversation that was meant to be private: "Father, the hour has come. Give glory to your son, so that your son may glorify you, just as you gave him authority over all people, so that your son may give eternal life to all you gave him ... I pray for them. I do not pray for the world but for the ones you have given me". Jesus is the King who must die. Yet, He says, "Father ... glorify your Son that your Son may glorify you."

Legend tells us that the Emperor Constantine had seen a vision where he saw a cross etched with the words, "In hoc signo vinces" (in this sign you will conquer †); so he had his soldiers carry a cross on their armor and shields. Yet, there are some in each century that insist on removing the cross from Christianity and the world. Erase Good Friday and you would have to put the glory of Easter Sunday in the back of the file cabinet. Yet, had Jesus listened to His fears and anxieties and not obeyed His Father's will, the Passion, the Crucifixion, Death and Resurrection, you and I would never know just how much God truly Loves us.

SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

FIRST READING: ACTS 1:12-14

This passage briefly describes the movements of the apostles following the Ascension of the Lord: they returned to Jerusalem and devoted themselves to prayer.

SECOND READING: 1 PETER 4:13-16

St. Peter reminds us that uniting our sufferings with the sufferings of Christ will result in exultation.

GOSPEL: JOHN 17:1-11A

This selection is the beginning of the "High Priestly Prayer" of Jesus and part of the last discourse. Jesus has completed much of his mission – with the obvious exception of His Passion and death. His concern and care is for His followers.

91. Did Jesus really physically Rise from the Dead?

The physical resurrection of Christ is the cornerstone of our faith. Without it, Christianity crumbles. It is precisely because the physical resurrection of Christ is at the very heart of Christianity that it is constantly under attack.

First, the physical resurrection of Christ is affirmed in the canon of Scripture. When the Jewish leaders asked for a miraculous sign, Jesus answered, "Destroy this temple, and I will raise it again in three days." (John 2:19) Scripture confirms that the temple he was speaking of was the temple of his own body (see verse 21). John states: "That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we have looked at and our hands have touched - this we proclaim concerning [Jesus] the Word of Life." (1 John 1:1)

Furthermore, the confessions of Christianity are replete with references to the physical resurrection of the Redeemer. Cyril of Jerusalem proclaimed, "Let no heretic ever persuade thee to speak evil of the Resurrection."

Finally, the characteristics of Christ's body bear eloquent truth to his physical resurrection. Jesus invited the disciples to examine His resurrected body so that they would know beyond the shadow of a doubt that it was the exact same one that had been fatally tormented. He also ate food as proof of the nature of His resurrected body.

Jesus provided the final exclamation mark for His physical resurrection by telling the disciples that His resurrected body was comprised of flesh and bones, "Touch me and see," He says, "A ghost does not have flesh and bones, as you see I have." (Luke 24:39)
