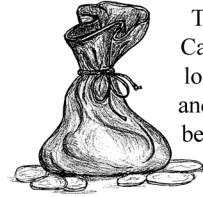

## From the Desk of Fr. Connolly

### October: the Month of the Holy Rosary The Battle of Lepanto

On October 7, the Roman Catholic Church celebrates the yearly feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. Known for several centuries by the alternate title of "Our Lady of Victory," the feast day takes place in honor of a 16<sup>th</sup> century naval victory which secured Europe against Turkish invasion. Pope St. Pius V attributed the victory to the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary, who was invoked on the day of the battle through a campaign to pray the rosary throughout Europe.

In his 1883 encyclical *Supremi Apostolatus Officio*, Pope Leo XIII echoed the words of the oldest known Marian prayer (known in the Latin tradition as the *Sub Tuum Praesidium*) when he wrote, "It has always been the habit of Catholics in danger and in troublous times to fly for refuge to Mary. This devotion, so great and so confident, to the august Queen of Heaven has never shone forth with such brilliancy as when the militant Church of God has seemed to be endangered by the violence of heresy ... or by an intolerable moral corruption, or by the attacks of powerful enemies." Foremost among such attacks was the *Battle of Lepanto*, a perilous and decisive moment in European and world history.

Troops of the Turkish Ottoman Empire had invaded and occupied the Byzantine Empire by 1453, bringing a large portion of the increasingly divided Christian world under a version of Islamic law. For the next hundred years, the Turks expanded their empire westward on land, and asserted their naval power in the Mediterranean. In 1565, they attacked Malta, envisioning an eventual invasion of Rome. The next year, three Catholic powers on the continent, Genoa, Spain, and the Papal States, formed an alliance called the *Holy League*, to defend their Christian civilization against Turkish invasion. Its fleets sailed to confront the Turks near the west coast of Greece on October 7, 1571.

Crew members on more than 200 ships prayed the rosary in preparation for the battle, as did Christians throughout Europe, encouraged by the Pope to gather in their churches to invoke the Virgin Mary against the daunting Turkish forces. Pope Pius V was granted a miraculous vision of the Holy League's stunning victory. Without a doubt, the Pope understood the significance of the day's events, when he was eventually informed that all but 13 of the nearly 300 Turkish ships had been captured or sunk. He was moved to institute the feast now celebrated universally as *Our Lady of the Rosary*.

## TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

### FIRST READING: ISAIAH 45:1, 4-6

This reading addresses Cyrus, King of Persia – a non-Jew who respected the religions and customs of those he conquered. Under him, the Babylonian captivity ended and the Jewish people returned home and rebuilt the temple. In fact, he sent with them vessels from the original temple and provided them with financial support.

### SECOND READING: 1 THESSALONIANS 1:1-5B

In writing the Epistles, St. Paul commenced with a formal salutation, such as we see in the beginning of this first letter to the Thessalonians. Although St. Paul made every effort to be self-sufficient, relying on God and his own labors, the Thessalonians did send him support, which St. Paul understood to express their faith, love and hope.

### GOSPEL: MATTHEW 22:15-21

"... repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belong to God." This is a well-known Gospel account. Although the role of the Pharisees is clear, it is interesting that the Herodians are mentioned. The Herodians and the Pharisees had opposing opinions about the payment of the census tax; the Herodians would favor paying the tax – the Pharisees would not. This alliance between the Pharisees and Herodians reflect their mutual determination to undermine Jesus.

## 112. Can you tell me more about the Renew + Re-build campaign I have been hearing about?

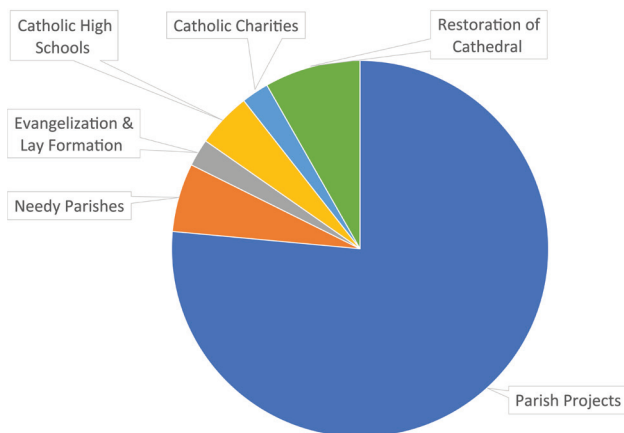
It is a multi-million dollar archdiocesan-wide initiative designed to update and improve our churches both physically and spiritually.

The physical part includes repairing, updating, renovating and improving the parish properties throughout the Archdiocese. The vast majority of the money (74%) raised will go toward those capital improvement initiatives. Depending on how much our parish raises, at least 74% will be used for parish projects.

The remaining 26% will support archdiocesan initiatives, which include extraordinary capital projects for needy parishes, Catholic Charities, Catholic High Schools, the restoration of St. Patrick's Cathedral, evangelization and lay leadership formation.

The Archdiocese plans to raise \$200 million for the campaign. Our parish's goal is \$2 million, with a list of the capital improvements found on page 5. Even Cardinal Dolan has a goal which he is expected to raise: \$23 million!

For the benefit of our parishioners, presentations will be given next weekend (October 28/29) in the Lower Church after all Masses at Immaculate Conception and then the following weekend (November 4/5) in Fr. Fata Hall after all Masses at Assumption.

### RENOVAR Y RECONSTRUIR

El jueves 5 de octubre, el Cardenal Dolan públicamente anunció la campaña de

Renovar + Reconstruir, una iniciativa de \$200 millones para lo largo y ancho de la arquidiócesis, iniciativa que beneficia grandemente a las parroquias y ministerios de La Arquidiócesis de Nueva York. El cuarenta por ciento de las parroquias han participado ya de la campaña. Debido al arduo trabajo y dedicación, pastores, líderes y parroquianos, la campaña ha logrado reunir una suma de sobre \$116 millones hasta ahora. Estos fondos causarán un gran impacto en toda la arquidiócesis, particularmente en proyectos y en necesidades capitales.

La Arquidiócesis de Nueva York se ha embarcado en la campaña de Renovar y Reconstruir nuestra Iglesia tanto física como espiritualmente. La vasta mayoría de los \$177 millones recaudados por las parroquias, quedarán en las parroquias, el resto servirá para cubrir los costos de campaña y otras prioridades de la arquidiócesis.

74% de los fondos (\$130 M) recaudados por las parroquias quedaran en las mismas parroquias para proyectos y necesidades capitales.
