

From the Desk of Deacon Anthony

Sir. We would Like to See Iesus

March 18, 2018

Have you ever played the Telephone Game in which a message is whispered from one person to another? Usually, the last person to receive delivery gets a very different message from what the first person said. The original message gets misunderstood.

When Jesus speaks, He is often misunderstood. Recall Nicodemus, for example, who had difficulty figuring out how a grown man can be born again. In today's Gospel, Jesus does it again, saying one thing, however, meaning more than folks would catch at first hearing. Perhaps we, too, miss some of what He is truly saying.

If, like the Greeks in today's Gospel, we want to see Jesus, and go where He goes, we're going to have to make a stop at the Eucharistic table. We're going to have to go with Him, and struggle to stay awake during a troubled night in the Garden of Gethsemane. And we are going to have to meet Him at the Cross, where He finds Glory, and we find forgiveness and salvation. For us there is no way around that Cross. Remember, when Jesus asked His Father, to save Him from His hour of trial, and take His cup of suffering away from Him, Jesus knew: the true road is not around His suffering, but rather through it.

Over the centuries, we have used lights, halos, trumpets, anthems, dances and ecstasies to describe what Glory could possibly be. The Church proclaims that Glory is the experience of being embraced by God's overwhelming love. A love that has no limit. Time or sin or death cannot overcome it. It is a love by which God gives us life in all its richness. When we experience God's love, we are transfigured, riding on a "Highway of Joy".

In St. John's account of the Last Supper, Jesus says there is no greater love than to lay down one's life for one's friends. On the Cross, that is what Jesus does. The eternal God dies for the love of us. Greater love than this, no one has.

The time is drawing near for our renewal at Easter of our Baptismal Union with the Death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. During this next week, as we prepare for Holy Week and reflect on the mystery of the Cross, let us approach this mystery with an open heart and with a willingness to go wherever it may lead us. When we read the law that Jeremiah says will be written on our hearts, we may find there the true meaning of God's Love. Jesus said, "I give you a new commandment: that you love one another as I have loved you. By this, everyone will know that you are my disciples."

How do we see Jesus? Let us take up our Cross and follow Him.



FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT



FIRST READING: JEREMIAH 31:31-34

Jeremiah was a prophet who unsuccessfully attempted to get the Jews to repent of their evil ways. We will delve into his Lamentations later this month at Tenebrae (March 29-31). But this passage looks to a future after the Babylonian Exile and a New Covenant.

SECOND READING: HEBREWS 5:7-9

In this passage, we are reminded that Jesus knew His fate was to suffer for us. He knew of His impending Passion and found it upsetting. Despite His feelings, He did what the Father required of Him. His obedience and suffering, serves as a perfect model for us.

GOSPEL: JOHN 12:20-33

In this passage, Jesus is preparing Himself and His followers for the Passion and Death he must bear. He implies that His death will bring life to many, using the familiar analogy that unless a grain of wheat dies, it cannot produce the fruit that is its destiny.

THE GOSPEL OF ST. MARK APRIL 12, 19, 26 AND MAY 3, 17



Join Fr. James Villa, OFM for five Thursday evenings (April 12, 19, 26, May 3, 17) in the Lower Church: 7:00 - 8:30 PM to explore the Gospel of St. Mark. Fr. Villa, a Scripture teacher, will lead us to an understanding and explanation of the Gospel of Mark which is used this Liturgical Year B in our Lectionary.

The Gospel of St. Mark is the second book in the New Testament, one of the four Gospels. Its traditional author is a man named John Mark, a companion of St. Peter, who wrote the Gospel using Peter's eyewitness accounts.

The Gospel of Mark is 16 chapters long, shorter than the other three Gospels. It is considered by most scholars to be the first of the four Gospels written, with a date between 50 and 70 AD. It was likely written from Rome to Romans, but more broadly, Gentiles.

The purpose of the Gospel is to present Jesus Christ to Gentiles and to encourage believers to endure and persevere in the face of persecution and perhaps even martyrdom. The emphasis of Mark revolves around significant events in the life of Christ, such as his crucifixion and suffering. Jesus as teacher and his followers as disciples are also key to the Gospel's message.

The text for the course will be the New American Bible Revised Edition (NABRE) which can be purchased at the Parish Office or on the first night of class. The Bible app, which offers the NABRE, is free.

133. Why do we need godparents?

In the Catholic Church, the role of *godparent* is more than an honorary title. While parents have the primary responsibility for teaching children about the faith and morals, godparents assist in that task. If something happens to one or both parents, the godparents then assume the parents' role.

A godparent should be a Catholic who has received the Sacraments of Holy Eucharist and Confirmation, and leads a life in harmony with the faith, serving as a spiritual role model for the new Catholic. In the case of a person wanting a godparent who is a Christian either not fully initiated or of another denomination, that person is recorded in the Baptismal Register as a 'Christian Witness'.
