

From the Desk of Fr. Sorgie

"Devotion and Decorum"

A lot of this is

sometimes reminders

are important!

n March 25, 2004, the Vatican's congregation for Divine Worship published a document entitled "Redemptionis Sacramentum" ("The Sacrament of Redemption") reminding all of us about the norms to be observed for the proper celebration of the Eucharist. One of the points made is: "All of Christ's faithful should participate in the Most Holy Sacrament of the Eucharist as fully, consciously, and actively as they can – honoring it lovingly by their devotion and manner of life."

A few practices that have crept into some parishioners' behavior at Sunday Mass here at Immaculate Conception and Assumption of Our Lady go contrary to what the Church hopes and intends for the devout celebration of the Eucharist.

- For one thing, some people consistently come to Mass late - often entering at an inappropriate moment and becoming a distraction to others.
- For another, some who do arrive before Mass seem to use the moments before Mass not for prayer and reflection, but for casual, and even loud, conversation. Such conversation is inappropriate and inconsiderate when others are trying to prepare for Mass.
- Moreover, several people have mentioned that there are parents who do not make any effort to oversee their young children, some of whom are allowed to play and run about the church at will. It is always a great joy to have entire families together for Mass, but it is the special responsibility of parents to make every reasonable effort to see that their children are well behaved and not a distraction during the Mass.
- It is unimaginable that there would ever be a reason to walk out of the Church after receiving Holy Communion. We are all obliged to return to our pews and make a thanksgiving and finish the Mass. Some of our priests, deacons and ex-

traordinary ministers of Holy Communion have mentioned that people receive communion and before it even dissolves in the mouth they are out the doors. Please bring this unfortunate practice to an immediate end.

Finally, a few people seem to think that the priest's last blessing is their signal to leave the church and often the altar servers and priest cannot exit the church because of the crowds in the main aisle, dashing to the exit while the final


> hymn is being sung. Everyone should wait until the celebrant leaves the body of the church before exiting the pew, although a brief prayer before leaving church is a highly recommended practice.

> A lot of this is common sense, but sometimes reminders are important! It is commendable that the

vast majority of our parishioners come to church well before Mass begins, enter into prayers and hymns with full attention, receive Holy Communion with devotion, and wait until the final hymn has concluded or the priest has left the body of the church before exiting. Your good example is a role model for our young people.
