From the Desk of Sr. Cora Lombardo, ASCJ

“Sacred Heart Spirituality: A Path to Holiness”

Jesus, have pity on me. If there is a soul in the world in need of your mercy, it is mine!

“Jesus inspired a holy reflection in me: Of myself I am nothing. All my being belongs to God. What was I in eternity? I was a total nothing. I would be nothing even now if God, who in His totally gratuitous goodness, had not chosen me among millions of others despite my lack of merit. I would return to nothing right now if God would withdraw His powerful hand that holds me as one suspended above the abyss. All that is good in me is a gift of God’s mercy.

“What a good shepherd Jesus is! ...He covers His sheep with His protection, with His staff; He welcomes them into His heart as into an indestructible shelter, He takes up arms and fights to drive out their enemy. He leads the lost sheep back into the fold, abandoning the ninety-nine that are with Him to run in search of the one who is missing. How quickly He runs! What effort He makes! And when He finds it all tangled in the thorns and bleeding, He weeps over it, embraces it with love, untangles it carefully and delicately so as not to wound it even more. Then He takes it on His shoulders like a father, not wanting it to bear the burden of the journey; and joyful for His find, proud of the precious load on His shoulders, He returns it to the fold. What untiring mercy!

“Today Jesus makes me feel a boundless confidence and trust in His Heart and I rejoice in this immensely, knowing that confidence is the key that opens the treasures of His infinite mercy.

“By leaving us His love, Jesus will leave us with all we could possibly want; His pure love is everything for us; every other thing is nothing.”

These words are the words of my spiritual mother, Blessed Clelia Merloni, foundress of the *Apostles of the Sacred Heart of Jesus*. We live in tough times and so did she. Often she suffered at the hands of her sisters.

God’s grace taught her to sacrifice out of love for those who caused her to suffer as Jesus did on the cross.

Blessed Mother Clelia Merloni made

160. "What is a monstrance?"

Eucharistic Adoration & Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament is a liturgical service during which the Blessed Sacrament is exposed in a receptacle, such as a **monstrance**, on the altar. It is a practice that fosters a deeper spiritual communion with our Lord. The word Benediction means "blessing" and at the conclusion of the service the priest or deacon raises the monstrance with the host and blesses the people in the sign of the Cross.

Eucharistic Benediction reminds us of the mystery of the Eucharist: that Jesus is truly present, body and blood, soul and divinity. It offers us an opportunity to "keep watch with me." (Matthew 26:38)

A monstrance (also called *ostensorium*) in the Roman Catholic Church and some churches is a vessel in which the Eucharistic host is carried in processions and is exposed during certain liturgical and devotional ceremonies. Both names are derived from Latin words (*monstrare* and *ostendere*) that mean "to show clearly."

At Immaculate Conception and Assumption we have Exposition & Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament each Monday and on the First Friday of the month from 12:30–7:00 PM. There are other moments throughout the year when we expose, pray and conclude with Benediction.

When a church is closed and taken apart, all of the

religious objects in the church get catalogued and sent to our warehouse in Staten Island, until someone needs and asks for them from other Parishes in the Archdiocese, around the country or the world. Recently while looking for statues, marble and appointments for our two churches and our new Chapel of the Divine Mercy, I came upon this beautiful monstrance you see pictured on the front of our bulletin. It was made for the Church of St. Joseph on Monroe Street in New York City (now Chinatown). In 1907 the church was a touchstone for Southern Italian Immigrants, particularly from Sicily. The church closed in 2015. The monstrance is large enough to be seen in the back pews of Immaculate Conception Church and will allow me to bring our current monstrance down to the Chapel of the Divine Mercy when the Parish Center is completed.

It had to be restored: the rays needed to be straightened, a crystal lunette was fabricated to hold the host because it was lost, and a protective carrying case made. **While the monstrance is priceless, the restoration and fabrication cost \$1,500. I am looking for a generous parishioner who might want to memorialize or honor someone with this restoration.** Call Fr. Sorgie if interested (914) 961-3643.

America Needs Fatima's Rosary Rally 2018: Oct. 13, Tuckahoe Village Square, Noon




