From the Desk of Fr. Lakmin Silva

Prayer: An Inner Openness to God

Prayer is not just receiving

what we ask for,

but an inner openness

to God which allows

His Divine Power

to be released in us.

As humans, we are made to find the meaning and happiness of in lives through our relationships. So our lives can be seen as a web of relationships. Dialogue or conversation is a vital part of the bonding aspect of them. We know if our relationship with the Lord is in place, all other relationships fall in

line. They become more meaningful and harness joy.

To keep our relationship with the Lord alive, we need to dialogue with Him, converse with Him constantly; we do that through prayer. Traditionally, there are four parts in a Christian prayer:

- Adoration, where we give God praise and honor for who He is as Lord.
- **Confession**, where we honestly deal with our sin before the Lord.
- Thanksgiving, when we verbalize our gratitude to the Lord.
- **Supplication** where we pray for the needs of others and ourselves.

Here is another way to view of prayer: prayer is one of the ways that God chooses to share His infinite power with us. Just as God's gift of intelligence gives each one of us power, so His gift of prayer gives us power. In other words, God set up the universe in such a way that we can influence it not only by the exercise of human intelligence but also by the exercise of human prayer.

Not every person can influence human affairs by the power of his or her intelligence, but every person-

-no matter one's IQ-- can influence human affairs by the power of prayer that God shares with us. God made us to be more than spectators to His creative power; He has given us a share in it.

This is part of what it means "to be made in the image and likeness of God." It's like children inheriting all that their parents own. When we have that complete trust in God, we build up that intimate loving

relationship with Him. When we talk to God in our hearts, when we communicate with Him in our innermost beings, when we pray, we connect to Him and His power starts to work in us.

Prayer is not just receiving what we ask for, but an inner openness to God which allows His Divine power to be released in us. As St. Alphonsus Ligouri says, "Acquire the habit of speaking to God as if you were alone with Him, familiarly and with confidence and love, as to the dearest and most loving of friends."

205. "Why are priests transferred from one Parish to another?

In the Code of Canon Law, which is the General Law of the Church, there are canons about Pastors and the allowance of terms by the Bishop of a Diocese. All over the world, different Dioceses establish terms for the Pastors of their parishes and men in Special Assignments for the Bishop.

Cardinal Dolan, as our Archbishop, has the authority to transfer his priests and has set down a Priests Personnel Manual which lists the rules. Except when a priest is newly ordained, the priest has a say in his future assignments. An Archdiocesan Priest Personnel Board, with elected priests from the various part of the Archdiocese, assists the Bishop in the process of transferring our priests.

Sometimes priests are transferred because they move from being a Parochial Vicar to a Pastor. Some are transferred because there is a need in another parish for the particular skills of a priest. At this time, Pastors stay for a maximum of 12 years in any one parish.

While it is hard for the priest and the people when he is transferred, we were ordained for service throughout the whole Archdiocese of New York. This means transfers to another parish when the Bishop calls us under the promise of Obedience: to hear him and, with joy, move on to another part of God's vineyard.

205. "¿Por que nuestros sacerdotes son transferidos de una parroquia a otra"?

En el Código de la Ley Canónica que es la Ley General de la Iglesia existen Canones acerca de los pastores y de la concesión del término dado por el Obispo de la Diócesis. Alrededor del mundo las diferentes Diócesis establecen terminos para los pastores en sus parroquias y para hombres en asignaciones especiales para el Obispo.

El Cardenal Dolan, como nuestro Arzobispo, tiene la autoridad para transferir sus sacerdotes, y para establecer personal sacerdotal. Manual que enlista las reglas. Excepto cuando un sacerdote nuevo es ordenado tiene voz en su futura asignación. Un sacerdote diocesano, la Junta de Personal, con sacerdotes electos de varias partes de la Arquidiócesis, asisten en el proceso de transferir a nuestros sacerdotes.

Algunas veces los sacerdotes son transferidos por que son promovidos de Vicario Pastoral a Pastor. Algunos son transferidos por qué hay necesidad en otra parroquia de un sacerdote con ciertas destrezas en particular. En este tiempo los sacerdotes pueden permanecer hasta por un período de doce años en una parroquia. Aunque es difícil para el Sacerdote y los parroquianos cuando el sacerdote ha sido transferido somos ordenados al servicio por la Arquidiócesis de Nueva York, esto significa transferencia a otra parroquia cuando el Obispo nos llama bajo la promesa de Obediencia: escucharlo y con alegría pasar a otra parte de la viña del Señor.
