Mass goers at this weekend's 11:30 Mass participate in the Rite of Sending. This is one of the liturgical rites which are part of the RCIA. It is a gateway on the path towards Easter, both for those who will be baptized at Easter, referred to as *Catechumens*, and those baptized Christians who will be welcomed into the Catholic Church at Easter, referred to as *Candidates*. The assembly takes note of their progress towards faith formation and expresses its approval of the Catechumens and Candidates. The Catechumens inscribe their names in the Book of Elect as a pledge of fidelity. At the Rite of Sending, the godparents and sponsors will testify to the readiness of the Catechumens and Candidates who will affirm their intention to join the Church. The Church then makes its "election" of these Catechumens to receive the Sacraments of Initiation, and sends them off to see Bishop Kihneman at the cathedral in Biloxi.

At the Rite of Election, in the presence of the Bishop, the godparents will further testify to the Catechumens' intention to join the Church and the Catechumens will affirm their decision. The catechist coordinator for our parish then presents the Book of Elect to Bishop Kihneman and the candidates individually come forward to be greeted by Bishop Kihneman and receive his blessing. Now the catechumens have a new status in the Church and are called "*The Elect*".

Similarly, at the Rite of Sending, the candidates (those baptized Christian who wish to be received into the Full Communion of the Church), are joyfully sent by us to be recognized by Bishop Kihneman and are assured of our care and support.

The Elect and the Candidates for Full Communion now begin a Period of Purification and Enlightenment. This is the final, intense preparation for the reception of the Sacraments of Initiation - Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist - at the Easter Vigil. Also at the Easter Vigil, the Candidates, already baptized in another Christian faith, will be welcomed into Full Communion with the Catholic Church and receive their First Eucharist and Confirmation.

The RCIA is a spiritually moving process beneficial to the whole St Thomas community. As we draw closer to the celebration of Easter, let us pray for these men and women who will be entering our Holy Catholic Church this Easter.

**Question:** Lent always seems to help me renew my relationship with God and strengthen my religious practice. Do you have any suggestions as to what I

could do to achieve that the rest of the year? **Answer:** The obvious answer may seem to be to do whatever you do during Lent all year round. But part of the power of Lent is that we focus as a community on renewing our faith and preparing for Easter. Our Lenten practices have a purpose and a goal. Therein lies the secret. When we focus our efforts on one virtue, or try to change one bad habit, or seek to deepen our understanding of one aspect of faith, we focus our efforts and give our full attention to what we are trying to accomplish. We tend to be more successful achieving our goals. More importantly, it has a ripple effect in our lives: one thing changes or is added to the spiritual mix of our lives and many aspects are changed.

All too often we leave our spiritual growth to chance and the practice of faith to habit, and then wonder why we have no sense of growth or progress. Think of it in terms of exercise. We walk, lift weights, bend and stretch to attain the maximum benefit from what we do. In addition, to keep those benefits, we eat healthful food and get enough vitamins and rest. Spirituality requires the same kind of attention: we pray, fast, read the Bible, receive sacraments, and do charitable work to maximize the benefits of practicing faith. #### THE LONG WALK

The walk down from Mount Tabor after the Transfiguration must have been a long one for Peter, James, and John. How differently they must have viewed the world with the eyes that had seen

what they had just seen. How uncertain they must have been.

I think it's important to remember that, on the mountain, they were amazed, yes — but first, they were afraid. We are given the image of these three grown men — these saints, these giants of salvation history — cowering in fear at the voice of God. It was not until Jesus touched them that they could even bear to look up.

Christ was transfigured on Tabor, but in a way, the disciples were transfigured as well. We are all changed by what we see and what we hear. That change can be hard because knowledge is hard. Truth is hard. Sometimes cowering is easier.

Go forth, God told Abram. I will make of you a great nation. Rise, Christ told his disciples. And do not be afraid.

I spend too much time cowering in fear at the voice of God. I cower even when the voice whispers into my heart instead of booming from the clouds. When it's the start of a hard day or a tough conversation. When it's the middle of a half-finished battle, big or small. When I know where Christ is and what he is asking, but I'm afraid because the walk down the mountain is so long, and the world that awaits me is so uncertain.


### Sharing the Gospel
