THE RITE OF SENDING

A key part of the RCIA process, occurs during the 11:30 Mass this weekend. It marks a crucial step for both Catechumens (those to be baptized at Easter) and Candidates (baptized Christians joining the Catholic Church). During this rite, the assembly acknowledges their progress in faith formation, and the Catechumens inscribe their names in the Book of Elect as a commitment. The assembly takes note of their progress towards faith formation **and expresses its approval**

****Godparents and sponsors testify to their readiness, leading to the Church's "election" of these individuals to receive Sacraments of Initiation. The Catechumens then meet Bishop Kihneman for further affirmation. At the Rite of Election, godparents reconfirm their intentions, and the Catechumens gain the title "the Elect." The Candidates are also sent forth for recognition by Bishop Kihneman. Following this, the Elect and Candidates enter a period of intense preparation, culminating in the reception of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil. The whole St. Thomas community is asked to support and pray for these individuals throughout this spiritually enriching journey.**

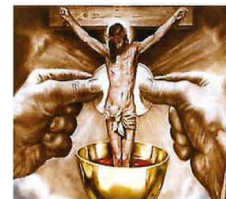

GOSPEL MEDITATION

February 25, 2024 2nd Sunday of Lent

As a college student, my prized possession was an after-market car stereo. It was my pride and joy: glorious audio, eye-catching display screen, and multi-disc CD changer. It drained my hard-earned dollars, but it was totally worth it. It drenched me in music everywhere I drove. On Ash Wednesday of my senior year of college, Father Tom, the Jesuit priest at my university said, "Pray for God to tell you what he wants you to sacrifice for Lent." I did. In my heart, the answer came: "Give up listening to your car stereo for forty days." I winced. Not possible, I thought. Can't do it. I made other plans. The next morning, I was stunned to find that my car had been broken into, and my fancy stereo ripped out and stolen.

God's command to sacrifice what we love is no joke. This week in Genesis 22, God says: "**Abraham!**" "**Here I am,**" he replied. Then God said, "**Take your son, your only son, whom you love — Isaac — and go to the region of Moriah. Sacrifice him there as a burnt offering on a mountain I will show you.**" Believe me, I know. We like to be in control. It chafes us that *God sets the terms* of what we must sacrifice, and how. But this is no impersonal, tyrannical process. Remember that God uses their names, Abraham and Isaac. God knows each one of us and the precious gifts He commands us to offer. Finally, our sacrifices are for our own good. Do we trust this enough to do what Father Tom asked me to do?

Lenten challenge: This week, I dare you to ask God: "What do you want me to give up?" He may ask for that which you love most. It will be something precious to you: time, money, a relationship, a dream, an opportunity. What matters is we trust Him and act sacrificially in line with His command. Whatever we sacrifice will of course come back to us as surely as the Risen Jesus — but that doesn't make it easy. — *Father John Muir* ©LPi

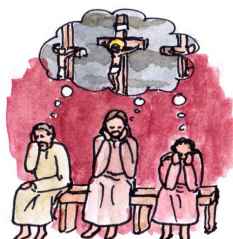

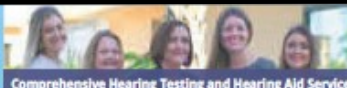
