MEDITATION

John 12:20-33

Whoever serves me must follow me.

You might wonder whether Jesus is giving the cold shoulder to these Greeks. They seem anxious to talk to him, but they can't seem to get a word in. Upon hearing that they want to see him, Jesus gives an enigmatic response: "Unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit." What kind of an answer is that?

Actually, it is the right answer. These Gentile converts to Judaism have come to worship at the Passover feast, but Jesus is saying that their Passover will not happen until after his resurrection. He is the "grain of wheat," who will be a sacrifice for sin. His death was necessary so that he could produce "much fruit" in the form of salvation for everyone. No one will be excluded, not even those Gentiles.

Today we can celebrate the fact that we too were once outsiders but are now a part of the "in crowd." Most of the people reading these words are Gentiles, not a part of the chosen people with whom God first made his covenant. We "once were far off" but have been brought near to God" by the blood of Christ." We are his adopted children, and there is no better family to be part of.

A question to reflect on, then, is "How welcoming am I to those I may consider outsiders?" We all have some notion of who belongs in church and who doesn't: that old man who never seems to smile. That couple whose kids can't sit still at Mass. That young man who seems too "liberal" or that older woman who seems too "conservative." They are all part of our family. They have all been grafted into Christ along with us. May we treasure each of them just as much as Jesus treasures us.

What an exciting time for all the Elect as they prepare to come into the church this Holy Saturday. They just finished their retreat and have two more classes to complete. We ask all the parish to pray for these Elect as they complete this beautiful journey. Last week on the fourth Sunday of Lent the Elect received the Creed. The Creed is the faith of the church professed personally by each believer. "I believe" is also the church, our mother, responding to God by faith as she teaches us to say both, "I believe" and "We believe." We must believe in no one but God. Faith is necessary for Salvation. The Lord himself affirms, "He who believes and is baptized will be saved; but he who does not believe will be condemned."

Believing in God, the only One, and loving him with all our being has enormous consequences for our whole life. It means coming to know God's greatness and majesty. We must serve God first. Faith in God leads us to turn to him alone as our first origin and our ultimate goal, neither to prefer anything to him and not to substitute anything for Him. God remains a mystery beyond words. God's very being is truth and love.
