Though the Rosary developed gradually over many hundreds of years, it was specifically given by Our Lady to Saint Dominic during a very dark time in the Church and in the world. Saint Alphonsus tells us, "In the thirteenth century of our salvation, Saint Dominic was greatly afflicted, seeing the deplorable state in which the Christian religion was: on account of the vices and heresies which filled Germany and France, and which, passing through Italy, had penetrated as far as Rome itself.

Desirous of opposing a barrier to such a flood of errors and sins, he had recourse to the august Mother of God, who... suggested to him as a remedy for so great an evil the devotion of the Rosary." And to make a long story short, he started preaching the rosary and spreading the devotion—and it worked! "Conversions were so astonishing and so universal, that, ...when people heard of the members of any family leading bad lives, they usually said that they either did not recite the Rosary or they recited it badly."

Our Lady gave the Rosary to Saint Dominic for the dark and evil times in the Church and in the world in which he lived. But let's be honest. The times we are living in now are even darker, and more evil by far—both in the Church and in the world.

As Our Lady gave the Rosary to Saint Dominic to be a blazing beacon of light and truth; to be a powerful defense and weapon against darkness and evil, so many Popes and Saints (and even Our Lady herself, as at Fatima) have, since the time of Saint Dominic, recommended the rosary, both to withstand and to combat evil.

As baptized (and confirmed) members of the Catholic Church, we are members of the Church Militant. As Saint Padre Pio would say, the Rosary is not just a weapon for fighting evil, it is *the weapon*; and it is easy to use.

No more excuses, no more delays; pray the Rosary every single day.

Pope Leo XIV announced on Sunday, Sept 28th, that he will proclaim St. John Henry Newman a doctor of the Church on Nov. 1, 2025, the Solemnity of All Saints. With the proclamation, Newman will become the 38th doctor of the Church, joining a select group of saints recognized for their enduring contribution to Catholic theology and spirituality. He is especially noted for his insights on the development of doctrine and the role of conscience. St. John Henry Newman was one of the most influential figures of the 19th century. A leading Anglican scholar and Oxford professor, his conversion to Catholicism sent shockwaves through the Christian world.

St John Henry Newman, who was canonized a saint on October 13, 2019, is honored on October 9 to mark the anniversary of his conversion to Catholicism rather than the day of his death, which was August 11, 1890. This decision reflects a unique approach by the Church, as it typically celebrates saints on their "dies natalis" (the day they died). The choice of October 9 allows for a celebration that highlights Newman's significant spiritual journey and contributions to the Catholic faith.

It has always been traditional when reciting the rosary and meditating on the particular mysteries to seek virtue or grace particular the appropriate tor being prayerfully mystery cónsidéred. The following áre thé four groups of mysteries.

Each mystery is commonly associated with a particular virtue or fruit which may be understood more deeply desired and sought in praying that mystery Many that praying mystery. Many différent schemes have been used; some of the more common associations are listed here.



 The Annunciation (of the Birth of the Savior to Mary): Humility

2. The Visitation (of Mary to Elizabeth and John the Baptist): Charity, Love of neighbor

3. The Nativity of Our Lord: Poverty of spirit,
Detachment from the things of the world, Contempt of riches, Love of the poor

4. The Presentation of Jesus at the Temple:Obedience, Purity of intention5. The Finding of the Child Jesus in the Temple: Piety

Sorrowful Mysteries (Tuesday, Friday)

1. The Agony in the Garden: Contrition, Conformity to the will of God

2. The Scourging at the Pillar: Purity, Mortification

3. The Crowning with Thorns: Moral Courage, Contempt of the world

4. The Carrying of the Cross: Patience

The Crucifixion: Final perseverance, Salvation, Self-**Denial**

Virtues of the Rosary are evident within each mystery of the Rosary which bears its own specific fruit. This means that daily recitation and meditations on the Rosary actually make you grow in virtué and hóliness.
