Third Sunday in Ordinary Time / Matthew 4:12-23



SU PALABRA HOY por el Reverendo William J. Reilly

Tercer Domingo en Tiempo Ordinario 26 de enero de 2020

"Mientras caminaba a orillas del mar de Galilea, Jesús vio a dos hermanos: a Simón, llamado Pedro, y a su hermano Andrés, que echaban las redes al mar porque eran pescadores. Entonces les dijo: 'Síganme, y yo los haré pescadores de hombres.' Inmediatamente, ellos dejaron las redes y lo siguieron. Continuando su camino, vio a otros dos hermanos: a Santiago, hijo de Zebedeo, y a su hermano Juan, que estaban en la barca de Zebedeo, su padre, arreglando las redes; y Jesús los llamó. Inmediatamente, ellos dejaron la barca y a su padre, y lo siguieron."
