ASH WEDNESDAY

FEBRUARY 22

Mass & Distribution of Ashes: 7:00 a.m. 12:10 p.m. 6:00 p.m.

Ash Wednesday & Good Friday are days of both <u>fast</u> and <u>abstinence</u>. Fridays of Lent are days of <u>abstinence</u>.

The law of **abstinence** obliges those 14 years of age and older not to eat meat. The law of **fast** obliges all those from ages 18-59 to refrain from eating between meals and to limit their eating to one full meal and two lighter meals for the day.

Ash Wednesday comes from the ancient Jewish tradition of penance and fasting. The practice includes the wearing of ashes on the forehead. The ashes symbolize the dust from which God made us. Ashes also symbolize grief, in this case, grief that we have sinned and caused division from God. Writings from the Second-century Church refer to the wearing of ashes as a sign of penance.

LENTEN PRACTICES

A Lenten fast doesn't have to consist of just fasting and abstinence from the things we love, but it can be adding things during this season of lent that will make our lives more meaningful.

Why do we give up things for Lent?

Today, Christians focus on their relationship with God, often choosing to give up something or volunteering and giving of themselves for others. The forty days represents the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptation of Satan.

- 1. Don't buy anything that you don't NEED
- 2- Throw Away 40 things for 40 days (think donate)
- 3-40 Days of home organization
- 4- No Gossiping
- 5. Work out daily to take care of the body God gave you.
- 6- Don't Eat After Dinner
- 7- Give Up Soda
- 8. Say 3 Nice Things to Your Spouse & Kids Daily
- 9- Don't Eat Out for 40 Days
- 10- Replace 30 Minutes of TV or Screen Time with 30 Extra Minutes of Devotion/Prayer Time.
- 11- Do Not Complain or Speak Negatively.
