

AMOR MEUS SPIRITUALITY CENTER IGNATIAN RETREAT

August 30 - November 29



Amor Meus Spirituality Center is offering a 12-week Ignatian Retreat entitled: "Finding Christ in the World" beginning Wednesday, August 30 -- Wednesday, November 29. It is facilitated by Sister Digna Vela,

OVISS. The participants making this retreat will pray at home each day with a given scripture passage and meet for one hour each week in a group to share. They will meet at Incarnate Word Convent on Wednesday mornings from 9:30–10:30 a.m. or on Wednesday evenings on Google Meet 6:30–7:30 p.m. Brief notes help move the retreatant into prayer around 12 themes. A stipend of \$100 for the 12 weeks includes a \$40 workbook amounting to \$5/week. The retreat is limited to no more than 10 persons. Call early to secure a space. A spiritual retreat is an important break, a few days spent in prayer alone with God. It is the spiritual equivalent of an annual car inspection or medical checkup: time in the presence of God, examining our Christian lives to try to see where we're at and how we can improve our relationships with God and others.

READINGS FOR SEPTEMBER 3: 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

1^t Reading: Jeremiah 20:7-9

You duped me, O LORD, and I let myself be duped; you were too strong for me, and you triumphed. All the day I am an object of laughter; everyone mocks me.

Whenever I speak, I must cry out, violence and outrage is my message; the word of the LORD has brought me derision and reproach all the day.

I say to myself, I will not mention him,
I will speak in his name no more.
But then it becomes like fire burning in my heart,
imprisoned in my bones;
I grow weary holding it in, I cannot endure it.

2nd Reading: Romans 12:1-2

I urge you, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God, your spiritual worship. Do not conform yourselves to this age but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and pleasing and perfect.

Gospel: Matthew 16:21-27

Jesus began to show his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and suffer greatly from the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed and on the third day be raised. Then Peter took Jesus aside and began to rebuke him, "God forbid, Lord! No such thing shall ever happen to you." He turned and said to Peter, "Get behind me, Satan! You are an obstacle to me. You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do." Then Jesus said to his disciples, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it. What profit would there be for one to gain the whole world and forfeit his life? Or what can one give in exchange for his life? For the Son of Man will come with his angels in his Father's glory, and then he will repay all according to his conduct."

CATHOLIC COMMUNICATIONS CAMPAIGN, BLACK & INDIAN MISSIONS, CATHOLIC UNIVERSITY OF AMERICA SPECIAL COLLECTION
