MASS ATTENDANCE OBLIGATION

CHRISTMAS, December 25, 2023, will be on a Monday this year and IS a Holy Day of Obligation. In conjunction with the Fourth Sunday of Advent, a clarification regarding Mass attendance obligations is in order. The faithful will need to attend two Masses – one for the Fourth Sunday of Advent and one for Christmas. Thus, you cannot attend the evening Mass on Sunday at 5:00 p.m., or the Mass at Night at 10:30 p.m., and consider it as fulfilling both obligations.

January 1, 2024, THE SOLEMNITY OF MARY, THE MOTHER OF GOD, falls on a Monday. While this feast is normally a Holy Day of Obligation, it is one of the Holy Days in which the obligation to attend Mass is abrogated (done away with) when it falls on a Saturday or Monday. Thus, even though there is no obligation to attend Mass on this day in 2024, coming to Mass would, nevertheless, be a beautiful way to honor the Blessed Mother, and to pray for God's blessings in the new year.

BLESSING FOR THE NEW YEAR

On New Year's Eve or New Year's Day, the household gathers at the table or the Christmas tree or manger scene. Many people make New Year's Day a day of prayer for peace. The calendar of the new year may be held during the blessing.

♣ All make the sign of the cross. The leader begins:

Let us praise the Lord of days and seasons and years, saying: Glory to God in the highest!

All respond:

And peace to his people on earth!

Then the leader begins:

Let us now pray for God's blessing in the new year.

After a short silence, parents may place their hands on their children in blessing as the **leader says**:

Remember us, O God;

from age to age be our comforter.

You have given us the wonder of time,

blessings in days and nights, seasons and years.

Bless your children at the turning of the year

and fill the months ahead with the bright hope

that is ours in the coming of Christ.

You are our God, living and reigning, for ever and ever.

R: Amen.





READINGS FOR the SOLEMNITY of The BLESSED VIRGIN MARY, MOTHER of GOD January 1, 2024

First Reading: Numbers 6:22-27

The LORD said to Moses: "Speak to Aaron and his sons and tell them: This is how you shall bless the Israelites. Say to them: The LORD bless you and keep you! The LORD let his face shine upon you, and be gracious to you! The LORD look upon you kindly and give you peace! So shall they invoke my name upon the Israelites, and I will bless them."

Second Reading: Galatians 4:4-7

Brothers and sisters: When the fullness of time had come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, to ransom those under the law, so that we might receive adoption as sons. As proof that you are sons, God sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying out, "Abba, Father!" So you are no longer a slave but a son, and if a son then also an heir, through God.

Gospel: Luke 2:16-21

The shepherds went in haste to Bethlehem and found Mary and Joseph, and the infant lying in the manger. When they saw this, they made known the message that had been told them about this child. All who heard it were amazed by what had been told them by the shepherds. And Mary kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart. Then the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, just as it had been told to them. When eight days were completed for his circumcision, he was named Jesus, the name given him by the angel before he was conceived in the womb.
