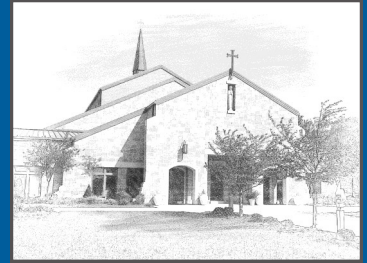

Elementary Religious Ed Lenten Service Project

St. Mary's Religious Education invites all parishioners to join us for a very special act of charity this Lent. Together we can support the work of Ronald McDonald House of Southwest Virginia (RMHC-SWVA) as they help our parishioners, the Castillo family, and care for little baby Vivianne Grace.

During Lent, we are asked to focus more intently on "almsgiving," which means donating to the poor and performing other acts of charity - one of the three pillars of Lenten practice." (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, no. 2462).

We encourage each family to fill one Ronald McDonald paper house with **tab tops from your soda, beverage or soup cans**. When aluminum tab tops are collected and recycled in exchange for money, collectively the tiny tab tops can help raise thousands of dollars to support the families of seriously ill or injured children receiving medical treatment in local Roanoke Valley area hospitals. It's that simple! Our whole parish can participate. Drop off your tab tops bundled in the provided paper houses or any clean dry container to the marked collection box located in the Narthex any time or to Pre-K Catechist Kim Dowdy in the Orange Room on Sunday mornings. We will deliver the tabs to Roanoke as a gift from St. Mary's Parish after Easter.
