

Leviticus and Numbers

When the Lord put upon my heart for us to read the whole bible together as a parish I was excited for us. As time went on, practically speaking, I also felt a little a little twinge of dread when it came to approaching the next five weeks of readings. Leviticus and Numbers can be very uneventful reading. Parts of the book of Numbers do have some stories and history to it, but it also lives up to its name....numbers. Leviticus also can be less practically inspiring to a Christian.

I have a few thoughts that might help as you go forward for the next several weeks. First know that Leviticus is very much a living document for many Jewish people today. While there is no Temple, so that they cannot partake of the sacrifices mentioned, there are many other things, which can be applied to their life of faith. The rules on keeping the Sabbath, Holy Days, and what is clean and unclean are very much alive. Please note, that while there are varying degrees of keeping these practices among those of the Jewish faith today, we also have that same experience of people at different levels of practice and understanding in our own Church.

Leviticus and Numbers, with the other books in the Torah (First Five books of the Bible), have helped to shape and maintain Jewish identity and faith for thousands of years through much trial and suffering. They have kept their identity as God's chosen people and what it means to live out that life in various cultures and times. Read these books with one ear in that direction.

Second, understanding Leviticus helps to understand the context in which Jesus lived and preached. Understanding His context helps to understand Him as well as the early Church in which the faith grew and developed. Knowing from where we have come, helps us to see more clearly what God has revealed and who we are invited to become.

Third, because Jesus came, became the one sacrifice, and revealed to us the fullness of the Father and Spirit, we are free to relate to God, the world, and one another in a different way. There is a particular lens through which Christians can read all of scripture and that lens is Jesus. We should not be looking down upon anything here, but understanding that in Jesus it is

fulfilled. At the end of each chapter I would ask that you say a prayer for the Jewish people, and a prayer of thanks to Jesus for who He is and what he revealed.

Once the next five weeks are done, it is all downhill from here with respect to reading the bible. There will be some dry patches here and there, but nothing like these weeks.

We are moving forward. Overall, I hope your reading is both enlightening your mind and feeding your soul. Remember that time spent with scripture is time spent with God.

"Lord, give us a greater hunger for scripture."


