#### Realigning Resources to Mission (RRM)

Our Parish RRM meeting will be this Tuesday, December 15 at 7:00 p.m. At present we hope to be able to both gather in person and have the meeting available by Zoom. If however, the restrictions on meetings continues then we will just operate via Zoom. There will be a link on our parish Website to give you access to the Zoom meeting.

What is this meeting about? Our diocese has been engaged in a strategic planning process, and at this phase the RRM committee has compiled much data and have crafted four principles which will guide their decisions moving forward. Before moving forward the RRM committee would like input and feedback on its vision. We will have an opportunity to comment on the specific vision and also to offer any other thoughts that we think would be helpful. Our feedback is important.

The meeting will go about an hour and a half. I hope you will make the effort to attend or to at least listen. While in the long term there will most likely be restructuring that occurs (though no plans have been made yet) the greater focus is on helping the diocese to refocus on mission. That particular refocusing on mission regardless of restructuring will affect us all. The mission is to make missionary disciples of Jesus.

It is important to keep your marketing consistent. In the above screenshot of the Buffalo website you can see it is very organized, colorful, and also has valuable information for customers. This is useful information to integrate into your bulletin advertisement.

#### Items of Interest

- 1.) Keep it simple. What is essential? Avoid too much information.
- 2.) What will catch the people's attention?
- Awards/Offerings "\$3.00 gets you admission and a 12 ounce soft drink." "Wi-Fi Available"
- 4.) We highly recommend having your ad in color to stand out from the competition.
- 5.) Add website address.
- 6.) Be consistent with other materials.
