

PERPETUAL ADORATION



At first you barely notice, but there it is, crabgrass in your flower garden. It is small and the thought might be to pull it out later. Then, as so often happens, it becomes part of the landscape and you no longer notice it. When it does grab your attention again, it is tall, wide and seedy! To really get rid of it, you must prepare for some real struggles to uproot it. In uprooting the crabgrass, you might find that other noxious weeds have taken root under the spread of the crabgrass and that some of the desirable plants have been choked out.

In our spiritual life, we also have weeds. We get crabby but excuse our short temper. After a fashion, we no longer notice that we are grumpy and critical of others even though our words can have a far-reaching effect and do harm to others. We might come to realize other weedy traits have begun to pop up. What to do?

We should come to the Master Gardener, Who will help us to uproot the vices and grow the virtues. Confession is a good start, but we need closer contact with the Master in the Holy Eucharist. We can receive Him in Holy Communion and come into Jesus' Presence in the Most Blessed Sacrament. This time allows Jesus to speak to our souls and to let His graces shine on us. We can grow again and weed out the sins of our lives with His help. He will nurture us with such tenderness.

Perpetual Adoration allows us to come before Jesus at any hour of any day. If we have time in the middle of the day ... or in the middle of the night ... Jesus waits for us. No hour is a wrong hour; every hour can be a grace-filled one. Although Perpetual Adoration is currently suspended, we look forward to resuming soon. If you are currently a Guardian, please renew your commitment to Jesus. If you are not yet a Guardian, consider how you might grow and flourish spiritually if you would give one hour to Jesus each week.

GOSPEL

From the Gospel of Matthew (Mt 18:15-20)
