




# Reflections on the Sunday Scripture



Isaiah 5:1-7 | Philippians 4:6-9 | Matthew 21:33-43

## Gospel

Jesus said to the chief priests and the elders of the people: "Hear another parable. There was a landowner who planted a vineyard, put a hedge around it, dug a wine press in it, and built a tower. Then he leased it to tenants and went on a journey. When vintage time drew near, he sent his servants to the tenants to obtain his produce. But the tenants seized the servants and one they beat, another they killed, and a third they stoned. Again he sent other servants, more numerous than the first ones, but they treated them in the same way. Finally, he sent his son to them, thinking, 'They will respect my son.'

But when the tenants saw the son, they said to one another, 'This is the heir. Come, let us kill him and acquire his inheritance.' They seized him, threw him out of the vineyard, and killed him. What will the owner of the vineyard do to those tenants when he comes?"

They answered him, "He will put those wretched men to a wretched death and lease his vineyard to other tenants who will give him the produce at the proper times."

Jesus said to them, "Did you never read in the Scriptures: The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone; by the Lord has this been done, and it is wonderful in our eyes? Therefore, I say to you, the kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people that will produce its fruit."

1. Christ seeks those who would follow Him toward the Kingdom. This is demonstrated in the fruit of their lives. Are you willing to follow Him? In what ways has your fruit (your life) been productive?
2. As in last week's gospel story, the people Jesus uses in the parable, are symbolic of others. The vineyard owner is God; stewards are the religious leaders; the servants are the Hebrew prophets; and the vineyard owner's son is Jesus. Do you understand how the story plays out for the people with Jesus, and for us?
3. In the gospel Jesus said, "The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone." Reflecting on your own life, can you think of an example where this proved to be of use? In other words what are the fruits of your life?

This gospel is about the sin and ruin of the Jewish nation. The Kingdom of God is the vineyard that God planted, with a hedge surrounding it for protection. He provided the wine press and tower (the rules of the Church) to promote its fruitfulness. Then he handed it the over to the community – the tenants. Servants of God (prophets) were sent to remind the community (tenants) of their duty. The servants planned to help them gather the fruit but they were rejected. God was forgiving and sent others, who were treated the same. Then God sent His Son, Jesus Christ.

Never did grace appear more gracious, for He came with more authority than the servants. However, He was envied, feared, and hated, and a plot was made to kill Him. The stone that the builders rejected is the same as the Son who was rejected, abused, and killed. The Son is the cornerstone – the cornerstone of our faith, salvation, and eternal life.








### Designation





## Deacons in the Catholic Church

In the simplest sense, a deacon is known as a “servant”. Deacons are responsible for many things within the Catholic Church, and his ministry should be present at home, in the parish, and in the secular world (outside the walls of the church). Deacons are called to be sacramental signs of a servant, as Christ is the servant to all.

### Ministries

Deacons should always be seen in one of three ministries:

**Ministry of the Word:** Deacons must evangelize and teach others to live a life of true Christian discipleship. He proclaims the Word of God in such a way that he first witnesses its empowerment in his own life.

**Ministry of Liturgy:** Deacons must be a connection between the sharing of our Lord’s gift at the Eucharistic table and then serving all of God’s children to meet their many hungers.

**Ministry of Charity and Justice:** As a direct response to Christ’s call to feed the hungry, welcome the stranger, clothe the naked, visit the sick and visit those in prison, deacons must be involved in one or more ministries in the community.

Deacons are called to encourage all those who are baptized to also participate in these ministries as Jesus describes in Mt. 25:35-36.

### Permanent vs. Transitional

Deacons are ordained ministers and thus receive the sacrament of holy orders. There are two types of deacons.

Permanent deacons are those called to be deacons for the rest of their lives. Many are married; however, if his wife’s death precedes his, he cannot remarry. Transitional deacons are single men who are ordained to the diaconate and will soon be ordained to the priesthood.

### Administering the Sacraments

Deacons are called to serve and exercise their office at the Mass; they may administer the sacrament of baptism, officiate at the sacrament of marriage, and preside at Communion services, adoration, exposition, and benediction. A deacon proclaims the gospel at Mass and, as the “Minister of the Cup”, he serves the Precious Blood.

### Vestments

Deacons wear clerical vestments that include an alb, a deacon’s stole, and a dalmatic. The alb represents innocence and purity, and a remembrance of Baptism. The stole is the emblem of the deacon which is worn of the left shoulder and drapes downward to his right side. While a priest wears a chasuble, the dalmatic symbolizes the office of the deacon. The dalmatic symbolizes a working apron which he wears as the Servant of Christ. The dalmatic has sleeves; a priest’s chasuble is open on the sides and does not have sleeves. A deacon may also wear a cope and humeral veil during other liturgies.

### A Deacon’s Good Works

With this information, the next time you see a deacon at the altar with our priests we hope you better understand the commitment they have made to God and to the community. They are a blessing to the priests, the members of the parish and as well as to the greater community. Pray for them as they strive to be *servant to the Church*.





## Automatic Bank Payments for Offertory Contributions

Quite often the office receives inquiries regarding on-line donations. While we do not offer “e-giving or on-line donations” setting up automatic payments with your financial institution could save you time and effort. This can be done using a checking or savings account—**not a credit card**.

Your bank will mail recurring checks for you directly to St. Mark the Evangelist. Here’s the process:

1. If you aren’t already using on-line banking, enroll at your financial institution.
2. Authorize your bank to make weekly/monthly/yearly payments to St. Mark the Evangelist Church. Your bank can help you if you haven’t done this before.
  - a. Make sure your bank has your Parish ID number printed on your check. (This 4-digit number is printed on your envelopes or if you’re not sure, contact the parish office.)
  - b. In the memo section of the check, have the bank identify where the money is to be directed; i.e., Weekly Offertory, St. Vincent de Paul, special collections, etc.
  - c. Your institution will send your contribution to St. Mark, and it will be posted in the church ledger.
