WEEKLY FLOW OUTLINE

1. Before You Meet With the Children

Read the Scripture readings (see below), especially the Gospel.

2. Invite the Holy Spirit

Ask the Holy Spirit to guide your words and actions.

3. Welcome the Children

Begin with a warm welcome and the Sign of the Cross.

4. Proclaim the Gospel - Read out loud directly from Scripture.

5. Reflection Questions (sample questions provided but follow the Spirit!)

Encourage children to participate but never require a child to speak.

6. Send Forth

Close with prayer and return to Mass reverently.

REMINDER

God works through your kindness, patience, and presence.

Trust that the Holy Spirit is at work—even in moments of silence.

"Let the children come to me." (Matthew 19:14)

THANK YOU

Your presence helps our parish children encounter Jesus in a way that is prayerful, welcoming, and suited to their age. You are not expected to have all the answers. Your role is simply to help the children listen to the Gospel and reflect on how it connects to their lives. Children's Liturgy of the Word is an invitation—an opportunity for children to feel safe, seen, and loved by God and by the Church.



Children's Liturgy of the Word – Cycle A



2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Scripture

- First Reading:
Isaiah 49:3, 5–6
- Gospel:
John 1:29–34

Jesus is the Lamb of God who takes away sin.



Reflection Questions

Personal: If Jesus takes away sin, what should we do when we mess up?

Relational: John the Baptist pointed people to Jesus. Who helps point YOU to Jesus—at home, at school, or at church?

Mission: How can you “point to Jesus” with your life?

Catechist Note

Keep it simple: when we make mistakes, Jesus doesn't push us away—He invites us back through forgiveness.

Sending Forth Prayer

Jesus, Lamb of God, thank You for loving us and forgiving us. Help us make good choices, and help our words and actions point others to You this week. Amen.
