Weekly Flow Outline

1. Before You Meet With the Children

Read the Scripture readings, especially the Gospel. Readings can be found at: <https://bible.usccb.org/readings/calendar>

2. Invite the Holy Spirit

Ask the Holy Spirit to guide your words and actions.

3. Welcome the Children

Begin with a warm welcome and the Sign of the Cross.

4. Proclaim the Gospel - Read out loud directly from Scripture.

5. Reflection Questions (sample questions provided but follow the Spirit!)

Encourage children to participate but never require a child to speak.

6. Send Forth

Close with prayer and return to Mass reverently.

Reminder


God works through your kindness, patience, and presence.

Trust that the Holy Spirit is at work—even in moments of silence.

Thank You

Your presence helps our parish children encounter Jesus in a way that is prayerful, welcoming, and suited to their age. You are not expected to have all the answers. Your role is simply to help the children listen to the Gospel and reflect on how it connects to their lives. Children's Liturgy of the Word is an invitation—an opportunity for children to feel safe, seen, and loved by God and by the Church.

1st Sunday of Advent - Be Ready for Jesus

Scripture

- First Reading:
Isaiah 2:1–5
- Gospel:
Matthew 24:37–44

Jesus invites us to stay awake and be ready for Him.



Reflection Questions

Personal: What things distract you from listening to Jesus at home or at school?

Relational: If you have argued with a parent, sibling, or friend, how is Jesus asking you to respond?

Mission: What is one way you can prepare your heart for Jesus this week?

Catechist Note

Help focus children on readiness and loving choices rather than fear.

Sending Forth Prayer

Jesus, help us be ready to love You every day. Amen.

A reading from the book of the prophet Isaiah

Isaiah 2:1–5

This is the vision that Isaiah son of Amoz had about Judah and Jerusalem:
