#### It's Time for St. Catherine's 200 Club—Our 11th Year!

What is the 200 Club? The 200 Club is one of the ways St. Catherine's Parish raises money for our Sister Parish, St. Anthony's, in Monte Plata, Dominican Republic. By purchasing a \$100 ticket, you are a member of the 200 Club. You and 199 other people will help to raise over \$12,000 this year.

What is the 200 Club goal for 2015? To create a safe playground for the children of Monte Plata and provide laptop computers to be used by the teachers and children of the Portál de Belén, the daycare center and school we support, and by the youth of St. Anthony's Parish.

What is fun about the 200 Club? Lots! For ten weeks, you are eligible for a weekly drawing where 3 lucky winners can each win \$100. The winners are announced weekly in the bulletin and on St. Catherine's website. At the end of the ten weeks, we have a dinner party at the Parish Center, catered by Dinosaur BBQ, and raffle off the last of the monetary prizes, including a grand prize of \$1,000.

How does the 200 Club help both St. Catherine's and St. Anthony's? The 200 Club helps St. Anthony's by funding specific projects each year—giving the community an influx of money to tackle some of the projects that their regular income can't accomplish. But the 200 Club has been very instrumental at St. Catherine's in helping us to learn more about our Dominican sisters and brothers, connecting to the work of St. Anthony's and the Portál de Belén, and building a closer relationship with the Missionary Sisters of Jesus. This year our 200 Club dinner will give us an opportunity to hear from both the youth and adult participants who are going on two separate trips to Monte Plata this year—helping to build a stronger relationship and carrying home stories and pictures of how our 200 Club projects are helping our neighbors in Monte Plata.

How has the money been used from previous 200 Clubs? Last year's fund drive helped ten families with home improvements and helped four young women (some of the first graduates of the Portál de Belén) attend college. In past years we have funded a bus for the school; built new homes, latrines, and water wells; funded additional classroom space; provided income for the teachers of the Portál de Belén; and provided funds for various youth and parish ministries. St. Catherine's has left a beautiful mark on the parish of St. Anthony. Over the last ten years, we have raised over \$100,000.

When does the 200 Club start and how can I join? Tickets will go on sale this weekend and will be available at Masses and in the Parish Center for the coming weeks, until all are sold. Weekly drawings begin the week of February 11. Our 200 Club dinner will be held on Saturday, April 25, beginning at 6 p.m. Buy a \$100 ticket and you are part of the club.

## "In the Loop" with the High School Youth Ministry

This Sunday, Sr. Kieran Sawyer will be leading the youth ministry session entitled "Character and Chastity." Our middle schoolers will join our high schoolers for this session. Our youth will learn a framework that explains what it means to be a person of character-helping them realize their personal responsibility for developing the virtues (character strengths) need to live as adult Christians. They will also talk about chastity as a way of channeling their desires toward authentic love. The following Sunday, January 18, Ann Marie will lead a session on the tough topic of pornography. In this session, participants explore the negative messages prevalent in our culture, the worst being those from pornography. Participants will look at its impact on relationships, thoughts, language, and moral values.

#### MIDDLE SCHOOL YOUTH MINISTRY

This Sunday, Sr. Kieran Sawyer will be leading the youth ministry session entitled "Character and Chastity." Our middle schoolers will join our high schoolers for this session. ## From Mary Lou Bailey-Smith

Dear Parish Family,

Recently, on December 21, we heard Luke's account of the Annunciation, and immediately following it is Luke's account of the Visitation, where "Mary set out and went in haste to a town in the hill country of Judah" (Luke 1:39). Why? Because it was revealed to her that Elizabeth, her cousin, who was advanced in years and supposedly barren, was in her sixth month. Luke then adds, "Mary remained with Elizabeth for about three months and then returned home" (Luke 1:56).

Mary offered Elizabeth the most precious "gift" one can offer another – that of compassion, time, and presence.

There are those in our own faith community who are advanced in years; who are homebound; who are in nursing/adult living residences; who are ill; who have lost a spouse or who are no longer able to drive —who are the Elizabeths of today. The Visitation story reminds us that there is always an invitation to "set out"—to go in haste and to remain; in other words, to be a modern-day Mary.

One of the most rewarding ministries here at St. Catherine's is that of being a pastoral visitor. We, like Mary, offer our time and presence—to visit, listen, share, enliven, pray, and to take the greatest gift of presence—Jesus Himself in the Holy Eucharist.

If you, as Mary did, can respond compassionately to this ministry, please consider joining us. You will discover that truly "it is in giving that we receive." #### WHY I WANT TO GO TO THE DOMINICAN REPUBLIC

On February 14, eleven youths from St. Catherine's will travel to our sister parish in the Dominican Republic. This week, *Claire Galanthay* explains why she wants to be a part of this trip:

I would like to go to the Dominican Republic because I would like to get out of my comfort zone and see what it would be like to live a lot more modestly than I currently do. I always have everything that I need close to home, and I feel that this opportunity will help me grow more as a person. I will get a glimpse into what it feels like to live where there aren't as many opportunities in life, and you have to work a lot harder. I also feel that connecting with these people will help me to become more in tune with the world instead of just staying inside my little bubble of the world. I will also have to be less shy to become friends with the people in the DR, which I feel will benefit me forever.

This opportunity to travel to the DR will help show me even more so how important God is to me. From what I have heard, everyone felt closer to God after going, because of how God was in each of the people who lived in the town. I also hope that after this trip I will continue to stay in contact with the people in the DR, and become great friends. Overall, I feel that this trip will help open up my eyes to the world, and I will want to help out those who aren't as privileged as myself so that they may live a better life.

# DIOCESAN PUBLIC POLICY PRIORITY: WOMEN'S EQUALITY ACT—EQUAL PAY FOR EQUAL WORK

This provision of the Women's Equality Act would close loopholes that allow employers to justify paying female employees less than men for equivalent work. It would also outlaw "workplace wage secrecy" policies that forbid employees from discussing their wage rates with each other. And it would create a deterrent by awarding damages up to 300 percent of unpaid wages for victims of willful violations of this law. Differences in pay stack up against women over the course of their lives, affecting their ability to provide for their families while working and affecting their Social Security benefits when retired. Diocesan Public Policy weekend, February 14-15, will be our opportunity to let our state legislators know of the importance to finally pass this and the other nine points of the Women's Equality Act that will truly benefit women, excluding the tenth point expanding abortion provisions.
