March 19—The Great Feast of St. Joseph

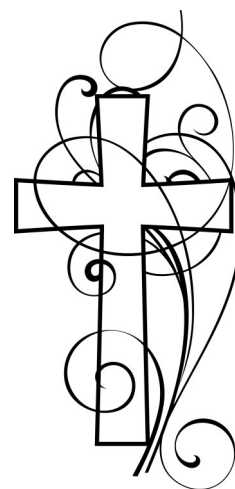
March 19 is the principal Feast of St. Joseph in the Western Church. He is the husband of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the stepfather of Jesus, and is known as the Patron of the Universal Church! In Sicily, San Giuseppe is honored for preventing famine in the Middle Ages. According to legend, there was a severe drought at the time, and the people prayed for their patron saint to bring them rain. They promised that if he answered their prayers, they would prepare a large feast to honor him. The rain did come, and the people of Sicily prepared a large banquet for their patron saint. The fava bean was the crop that saved the population from starvation and is a traditional part of St. Joseph's Day altars and traditions, as is giving food to the needy. This year we will be hosting a St. Joseph's Day Table with traditional Sicilian foods. Mass will be at 5:30 p.m. and the Blessing of the Table will be at 6:15 p.m. on March 19 in the Parish Center. All are welcome.

March 22—The Second Annual Teach Us to Pray Day

The Teach Us to Pray Day, on March 22 from 1–5 p.m., will provide you with the opportunity to learn about a variety of different prayer forms, to experience new ways of praying, and to learn more about Catholic prayers, personal devotions, and our liturgy. We invite you to come for the whole event, or any part of it (see the inside of the bulletin for the schedule). In addition to three rounds of workshops, we will have Prayer Stations set up in the Parish Center. There are interactive ways for you to pray—using your hands, your mind, and your creative spirit. The Prayer Stations are designed for people of all ages, but may be particularly good for youth and children, especially when guided by a parent. As you know, there are many ways to pray, and sometimes if I'm not familiar with a certain kind of prayer, I can feel intimidated. This is an opportunity to test the waters ... just dip your toe in to see how it feels.

March 24—The Day of Penance and Mercy

On March 24 we will be celebrating the third annual Day of Penance and God's Mercy. The Sacrament of Reconciliation will be offered throughout the entire Diocese of Rochester from 12:30 p.m. until 7:30 p.m. We always offer the Sacrament of Reconciliation, but this day is different. It is a day when every parish opens wide the doors of God's mercy, which is available to all. In the past, as a priest, I have found these days incredibly healing and moving for myself as well as the penitents. We all know that God forgives, but opportunities like the Day of Penance and God's Mercy somehow concretize that knowledge. If you are in need of God's healing and mercy (as we all are), I urge you and welcome you to this day of healing.

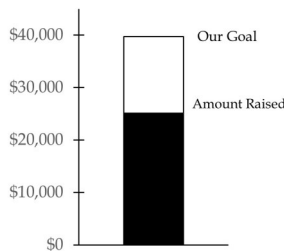

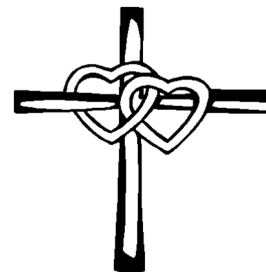
LOAVES AND FISHES

From the Book of Joe

Dear Parish Family,

If you've taken some time and looked carefully at the creative renderings of the new Parish Center, you may have noticed that there is no equipment in the area designated as the kitchen.

The Diocesan Building Commission has been urging parishes not to design new buildings with commercial kitchens, but rather with warming kitchens only. The idea is that all food would be prepared off campus and catered in; this would save on liabilities, health inspectors, and upkeep of the equipment.

The parish leadership and I drafted a letter to the bishop stating our concerns about the limitations of a warming kitchen to our ministries. I wanted to share the letter with you:

Your Excellency:

I am writing on behalf of the community of St. Catherine of Siena Parish. As you are aware, we are in the process of building a new Parish Center. There are multiple reasons for a new Parish Center, not least of which is a new kitchen facility. We have been counseled by the Diocesan Building Commission to incorporate a "warming kitchen" into the building. The Facilities Committee, the Pastoral Council, and Parish Leadership believe that this is shortsighted and will diminish our ministries. There are ministries that are dependent on our ability to prepare food on the premises.

I have been contacted by one of our parishioners (an owner of two local restaurants) who wants to pay for a commercial kitchen to be installed in the new Parish Center. Needless to say, this is a substantial gift to our community.

I am asking if we can submit the installation of a commercial kitchen as an alternate bid alongside the warming kitchen in light of this generous gift on behalf of the Parish. I have also included a scoping of the present use of our kitchen facility so that you know how much this is used by the parish.

WHY I WANT TO GO TO THE DOMINICAN REPUBLIC

On March 7, thirteen people travelled to our sister parish in the Dominican Republic. **Juan Arroyo** and **Giona Bienvenue**, age 4 (who is traveling with his mom, Marie, and dad, Breton), explain why they are excited to make this trip:

Juan Arroyo

I am going to the DR for the sixth time because I love the paradox of encountering things that are the same, but different. The children of the Portál de Belén are still in preschool and early grades, but they are no longer the same kids I met on earlier visits. The teens we meet are the same kids that we helped in the Portál's early years, but a lot older now. Are they the same? There are two new Sisters doing the work in Monte Plata, and third new one is in training. The veteran Sisters, though, are older, and their hair a little whiter. We all speak the same Spanish, until we notice our different accents and laugh with each other about how we say things in our different, but Spanish-speaking homes. Our projects are always the expression of our same commitment to help our brothers and sisters who are less fortunate, but we are helping different people all the time, and in different ways. In Mass we might hear the same familiar readings about helping the poor, about injustice, and our call to action, but it all sounds different when we put new faces on the suffering.

I am going to the DR to see the same God I have always known, but in the different projects we support, in children and adults with the same and different faces, and in the same but changing hands of the Missionary Sisters of Jesus.

Giona Bienvenue

We asked Giona to tell us why he wanted to travel to the Dominican Republic and he responded, "It would be nice to meet other kids in other parts of the world. I would like to see the toys the kids play with and meet their mamas and papas. I would like to try their food."

As parents, we both feel that travel is a very important aspect of what we can bring to Giona's upbringing. We believe that the greatest way to show Giona the wonder of all creation is through as much firsthand experience with the people and places of the world as possible. Despite his young age, Giona has already embarked on one international trip to Valencia, Spain, in the summer of 2012. On the afternoon we arrived, we ate at a small cafe just off the old city center. As is typical, Giona did not want to sit still and wandered into the kitchen, where he found Dani, the son of the café owners. The two immediately began to play together as if they were neighborhood friends rather than two children separated by half a world. It is further experiences like these that we wish to give Giona through the Dominican Republic trip. We also hope to instill in him the same love for serving others that we were both taught as children. We feel that seeing firsthand what can be accomplished by those who set out to help others and how it is received by those in need is one of the most important gifts we can provide to him as our child, and we hope that participating in this trip can serve as part of that learning for him.
