

From the Book of Ann Marie

Dear Parish Family,

Many years ago, I was asked to help a Diocesan Youth Ministry Office evaluate the programs they were offering. I ended up using an analogy to help them think through what they wanted to keep, change, move around, add, etc., and the analogy that we used was a garden.

This is the process that we are going to use on Wednesday when we have our Visioning Meeting here at St. Catherine's from 7–9 p.m. Everyone is welcome to come and participate – but I thought it might be helpful if I told you about the process so that those of you who can come will be primed for it, and those of you who can't make it might do some thinking about the process and send me an email with your feedback. It would be most welcomed.

So if St. Catherine's programs are a garden, there are some things in our garden that are like trees, some that are perennials, and others that are annuals. For those who aren't big gardeners (or are just not following my train of thought), here is what I mean:

- Trees: A tree in a garden can be chopped down or trimmed, but it can't really be moved. In most gardens, we plant them where we want them and they are a pretty permanent part of our garden. We mourn a little when a storm brings them down. For St. Catherine's, I would propose that one of our trees is our relationship with the Portal de Belén. We would mourn if it went away and it is big part of how we see ourselves.
- *Perennials:* These are plants that come up every year (like tulips). We can transplant them somewhat easily, but mostly we leave them where they are and they bloom each year at different times throughout the season. We can trim them back or split them if they get too big. There are a lot of "perennial" events at St. Catherine's the upcoming parish picnic is an example.
- Annuals: Annuals are those flowers that we plant each year (like geraniums). We add them to our gardens to bring a dash of color, or to fill out a space, or because we happen to love that particular flower. This year's "annual" was our Unite campaign and all the planning meetings and events that were associated with it. The adult D.R. trip is another example.
- *Soil:* Using this analogy, I am going to suggest that our liturgy, faith formation, and other things required by Canon Law are the soil that the whole garden is planted in. There is literally no garden without them. However, it is fair that we look at the quality of the soil and figure out what needs a little strengthening to bring out our best.

I am hopeful that this analogy and the process we will use will help us evaluate those things that make up our St. Catherine's calendar and shape the way that we live, pray, and grow in faith together. I think it will be a fun evening, especially if you have a little creative energy and don't mind getting your hands a little dirty in the garden!

Again, all are welcome to our Visioning Meeting this Wednesday, May 27, from 7–9 p.m. You don't have to be "in the know" about all of St. Catherine's events to participate. You don't have to bring all sorts of new ideas, although new ideas are welcome. All you need to do is enter in, share your experiences and ideas, and help us reflect on where we have been and where we would like to go. CALL TO RESPOND TO CLIMATE CHANGE

In his 1990 World Day of Peace message, St. Pope John Paul II warned that "the gradual depletion of the ozone layer and the related 'greenhouse effect' has now reached crisis proportions....It is necessary...that the entire human community - individuals, states and international bodies - take seriously the responsibility that is theirs." By the end of 1990 the world's leading industrial nations and corporations came together to end the production and phase out the use of ozonedepleting chemicals. They also agreed to financially assist poorer nations' transition to safer products. In addition to reducing your own carbon footprint, contact your Senators and Representative and tell them that you want the United States to take leadership in reducing worldwide greenhouse gas emissions and providing the support necessary for poor nations to comply with new reductions.

Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW) Ages 3 through Kindergarten

Children's Liturgy of the Word serves children, ages 3–kindergarten, in better understanding the Scriptures. CLOW takes place during the 9 a.m. Mass. Children and a parent are dismissed at the beginning of the Liturgy of the Word and the readings are explained in a way that is meaningful to them. Sacramental Preparation

Sacramental preparation includes the following:

- Baptism—First-time parents should schedule a meeting with Fr.
 Joe prior to or soon after the birth of their child.
- First Reconciliation—Children in 2nd grade prepare for Reconciliation with their parents during a six-week program in the fall/winter. Reconciliation must precede First Eucharist.
- First Eucharist—
 Children in 3rd grade
 or older prepare for
 their First Eucharist
 with their parents
 during a nine-week
 program in the
 winter/spring.
- Confirmation—
 Youth in 8th grade
 or older begin a two
 - year program which is a part of youth ministry sessions and additional programming.
- Marriage—Couples should schedule a meeting with Fr. Joe at least six months prior to their marriage to participate in marriage preparation.

All children and youth must also be involved in CFF / MSYM / HSYM to participate in Sacramental Preparation Programs. Adult volunteers are needed to serve as leaders of these ministries.

Children's Faith Formation (CFF) Grades 1–5

Children's Faith Formation is designed to help children to better understand and appreciate the Catholic faith. Classes are held on Sunday mornings, from 10:15–11:15 a.m. Classes meet by age group for about 30 hours per year with a class size of 15–25. Occasionally, all-class sessions are held around specific holy days and themes. Children can also participate in home-study courses, if desired. Also included in CFF are occasional programs to help children learn and participate in faith-based activities. These include:

- St. Nicholas Day—held in mid-December. Includes the Christmas Pageant.
- Stations of the Cross—held on a Friday in Lent.
- Service Projects—occasional service opportunities are scheduled throughout the year within the children's classrooms.


- Life and Faith Sessions—weekly opportunities for discussion and learning. Most Sundays from 10:15– 11:15 a.m.
