CHANGES TO OUR FAITH FORMATION AND SACRAMENTAL PROGRAMS

As some of you may know, Bishop Matano promulgated newly revised Sacramental Guidelines this past year. In light of the new guidelines, the St. Catherine of Siena staff has made some decisions that will affect how faith formation and sacramental preparation classes are structured. Below are some of the changes that will be instituted as of fall 2015.

Changes to Our Sacramental Programs:

For all sacraments: For a child to receive First Reconciliation or First Eucharist, he or she must have participated in faith formation for the whole year prior to the year they begin preparation for the sacrament. For Confirmation, they must participate for two years. The family must be registered with St. Catherine of Siena Parish.

First Reconciliation: First Reconciliation preparation will begin *no earlier than second grade* and will begin in the fall of the year. The sacrament will take place in December 2015.

First Eucharist: First Eucharist preparation will begin *no earlier than third grade* and will begin in the spring of the year. The sacrament will take place in May 2016. This change is being made because children must receive First Reconciliation prior to First Eucharist, and preparing for and receiving two sacraments in a year was too difficult for families and diminished the importance of both sacraments.

Confirmation: Young people wishing to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation must participate in Middle School Youth Ministry on a consistent basis throughout seventh and eighth grades. In ninth grade, they will participate in a retreat and classes in preparation for the sacrament. For those currently in high school who have not yet received Confirmation, special arrangements will be made.

Changes to Our Faith Formation Programs:

6th grade returns to Sunday morning: Because of changes being made to Middle School Youth Ministry related to the Sacrament of Confirmation, the sixth grade class will be combined with the fifth grade class and return to faith formation on Sunday mornings. The curriculum will have a two-year plan.

Parental involvement: Parents are always the first teachers of their children, and this is especially true within their religious education and formation. To help with the collaboration between the catechists and parents, we are asking that parents sign up to be an assistant for at least one of the faith formation sessions during the year, for each of their children. This will allow the children to see their parents engaged in their learning and allow the parents to have a better understanding of the formation their children are receiving.

SLEEP OUT FOR THE HOMELESS REVIEW

We had a very successful Sleep Out for the Homeless event last weekend and wanted to update you on how we fared! Eleven of our youth participated in this event, along with three chaperones and three other adult volunteers. Our participating youth were *Ben Earls, Thomas Galvin, John Oh, Mikaela Garcia, Lauren Way, Teddy Galanthay, Ana Maria Arroyo, Lydia Albonesi, Elizabeth Jesch, Bridget Fetsko, and Andrew Galvin*. We want to thank *Steve Jesch, Tom O'Toole, and Ted Galanthay* for chaperoning the event, along with *Silvia Abbiati, Susan Durnford, Ann Marie Eckert, and Tony Vesco*, who volunteered their time for specific activities throughout the event. We were able to raise \$450 for our local chapter of Rescue Mission, and brought in 10 large boxes of clothing donations to Rescue Mission and Covenant House in New York City, 3 boxfuls of food donations for the Food Pantry, and 17 homemade lasagnas for Loaves and Fishes. The youth experienced a pretty cold and rainy night outside and were able to get a small glimpse of what it would be like to be homeless. They received great insight and were able to reflect and brainstorm ideas on how to help those in need.



From the Book of Ann Marie

Dear Parish Family,

We have gotten a number of questions from parishioners about the photographs that we gave out a month ago of the children of the Portal de Belén, so I thought it might be helpful to provide you with a little more information.

As we hope you know, when our youth went to the D.R., they were tasked with collecting information about and taking a picture of each of the 232 children currently enrolled in the Portal de Belén. We wanted those pictures for two reasons:

1. The children and families at the Portal don't have a lot of access to photography, so we thought they would enjoy having a picture. We were right. The children were thrilled to have a picture of themselves and the parents were also very happy to have a picture of their child(ren).
2. We wanted you to have a picture of a child as well. We thought that if you could see their smiling faces, it might help you feel a little more connected to the Portal and more conscious of how necessary our support is to the children and the school.

As you know, for the past 15 years, St. Catherine's has been sending \$1,000 a month to support the school. During those years, the number of students has gone from 60 to 232, a whole school complex has been built, and the staff has grown. The Sisters will never be able to operate the school without donations, since they serve the very neediest of children free of charge. They get funding through the Dominican government, some education grants, and St. Catherine's regular donation, but they still need an additional \$1,100 a month to make ends meet. This seems like money our parish community could provide, especially in light of all the years we have been committed to this school and all the benefits we have received through this relationship.

The \$1,000 a month that we have currently been sending comes through the D.R. bowls at our Church doors. The coins, bills, and checks that parishioners donate weekly (or occasionally) are what has always made this donation possible. Families and households do this differently, but if we could all get behind this effort, and if every registered household at St. Catherine's were to share equally in supporting the Portal de Belén, we would only need \$40 a year per household to double the amount that we send. This seems so completely doable for our parish – this is only \$3.33 a month per family!

A few answers to FAQ:

- *How should I donate this \$40 (or more)?* Donations can be given as they have always been given – through the D.R. bowls in Church. You can also send a check to the parish marked "DR Bowls." We now also have a credit card option for donations. Go to: <https://stcathofsiena.securegive.com> to explore this way of donating a monthly or one-time gift.
- *Will my donation go to my pictured child?* Our relationship is with the school and each child benefits equally from the solid education, quality food, and loving relationships that are provided at the Portal, so the answer is both yes and no. Your donation will have a positive effect on your pictured child, but your donation won't go specifically to that child.
- *Why can't I designate my money to a specific child?* The Portal serves the neediest of Monte Plata, but even within the school, some children are better off than others. The Missionary Sisters of Jesus make sure that those who need clothing, food, help with medical expenses, and so on get what they need. Our donations make that possible. The Sisters are in a much better place to decide how to spend the money that we send. Additionally, this type of charitable giving (one family to another) would be very time intensive for the Sisters, and they don't have the time or energy to add this to the good works they are already doing.

I sincerely hope that you are willing to make a financial commitment to the children of the Portal de Belén. After being there this past winter, I can't imagine a better place for my money to go.

PARISH PICNIC SETUP AND CLEANUP

FAITH IN BOOKS COLLECTION

Throughout the month of May, we collected new and gently used children's books for the Family Reading Partnership, a nonprofit community organization that promotes early literacy. There is still time to donate books; please bring them in as soon as possible and we can transport them to Big Red Bookshelves in the area.

OAR JAIL DRIVING PROGRAM

Incarceration causes separation and stress. Families and friends, as well as inmates, can feel cut off. The OAR Jail Driving Program provides rides to the families and friends of jail inmates to help them stay connected. The jail is located on Warren Road, half a mile past the Post Office. It is not easily accessible to those who do not have a car. Jail visiting hours are on Tuesdays and Saturdays. Volunteers sign up to drive visitors for a morning shift (9:15 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. visits) or for the afternoon shift (1:15 p.m., 2:30 p.m., and 3:45 p.m. visits). Generally drivers sign up for one or two shifts a month, but drivers can also fill in once in a while. Those needing a ride make their request to OAR, and then OAR contacts the drivers the day before with the details. The goal is simple—to help jail inmates stay connected with families and friends. 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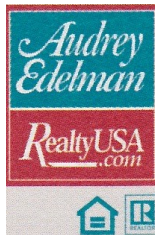
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
