Help to make Christmas a little brighter for individuals and families in our community.

At St. Catherine of Siena, the spirit of giving abounds! As the Christmas season approaches, the annual Giving Tree project arrives. In this season we are reminded of the many blessings bestowed upon us, and we joyfully spread these blessings to others. Many people in our area struggle throughout the year to provide for basic needs, and Christmas gifts are not always a possibility once their difficult choices are made. The Giving Tree has been a way to help bring some of the joy of the season to those around us.

As you may know, the Giving Tree has been a project for many years at St. Catherine's. It is always amazing to watch the tags fly off the trees and see our community's spirit of giving in action. As the years pass by, we like to reflect on how the Giving Tree affects our community and make sure we are meeting needs in a way that is giving but also helps those around us feel able to give of themselves.

We all know the joy of finding the perfect gift, wrapping it with care, and presenting it to those we love. We would like the people and groups supported by the Giving Tree to have this part of the experience as well. The tags will have a sticker letting you know if the gift should be wrapped or unwrapped.

- If we are asking them to be unwrapped, it is so the parent or guardian can see the gift and know what is being given, and perhaps add to it or complement it with something they can afford. (We will be collecting gift wrapping supplies and sending them with the unwrapped gifts so that isn't an added expense to families in need.)
- If it is to be wrapped, it is because that gift will be given directly to a person (perhaps in a nursing home) who doesn't have a lot of family or friends from whom they will receive gifts, and therefore wrapping it and including a card would be appropriate. We receive such amazing feedback on what a joy it is for these groups to gather and enjoy the opening of gifts together!



The Giving Tree will be up from **November 14–29**. All gifts are due back by **December 5**. As you consider the Giving Tree tags this year, please reflect on the joy they will bring to someone else's Christmas – and yours! May this opportunity be a gift to you and others.

From the Book of Ann Marie

Dear Parish Family,

Over the past two weeks, our community has gathered in three unique and wonderful ways. Each gave us a chance to be community for each other in a different way. We are so very blessed to have so many different ways that we can connect with each other.

Our Welcoming and Social Committee infused some newness into our annual Harvest Festival by bringing in a square dance caller. Most of the people that I talked with prior to the event were skeptical about square dancing. "I haven't done that since fifth grade" was the most common response I got from anyone. But after the Harvest Festival, there was nothing but enthusiasm for this very fun activity! If you don't know it, square dancing is a great way for people to interact – all ages, abilities, sizes, and genders. It makes you laugh a lot (because almost no one is actually good at it!) and gets you dancing with lots of different people because you are constantly switching partners or dancing with your "corner"! Great fun was had in our square dancing and that led to additional fun on the dance floor with kids, teens, and adults all joining in the Electric Slide, the Chicken Dance, and other group dances. The food was great, the interaction between people was wonderful, and the gathering of all ages made it a really fun night for all.

Last Sunday we hosted a wonderful music celebration here at St. Catherine's as we dedicated our new Steinway piano. So many people came to hear our choir and guest musicians fill our Church with the most beautiful music. Members of our choir worked for more than three months to bring their very best to the celebration – and their best was amazing! Mozart's *Missa Brevis in F* was followed by three very different piano pieces, played by Alan Giambattista, Mary Holzhauer, and Bill Cowdery. Then the choir came back to close with *Ave Verum Corpus*. Sherry invited anyone who had sung this piece to join the choir, and so the afternoon ended with about 15 additional singers adding their voices to this beautiful hymn of praise. Truth be told, I am not much of a music person in my day-to-day life, and classical music is not something that I spend a lot of time listening to, but last Sunday was quite amazing. The energy in the room was palpable – from both the performers and the listeners. Our community is so greatly blessed with such talented singers and musicians, but also with lovers of good music. Lots of parishioners came out for the event, including a whole group from Brookdale Senior Living, and there were friends from other parishes and from throughout the community. I know that Sherry hopes to make a music event a part of our yearly calendar, so if you missed this one, you will have many more opportunities to enjoy the beautiful work of our music ministry.

On All Souls Day, about fifty of our parishioners came together for our annual Mass of Remembrance. Each year we gather to remember those who have died in the past year, and those whose deaths continue to leave a big hole in our hearts. Although very different from the other two events, at this event the Christian community came together in support for each other. All of us who gathered have known the heartbreak of losing someone we love, and so we lift up one another in prayer, through a sign of peace, and simply by coming together in remembrance. The Mass of Remembrance is a simple way that we support each other, remind ourselves of the promise of eternal life, and console ourselves with the knowledge of God's great love and mercy for us and for our departed loved ones. Many thanks to Deb Roe for coordinating this Mass and reception again this year. It is a great gift that she gives to our community.

Next Sunday we will launch our next big community event – our Parish Retreat. I am so excited to have my friend Robert Feduccia in town – to introduce all of you to him and him to all of you. As people have mentioned to me before, I have great ministry friends, so it is always a great joy for me when I can bring you all together. I hope you will come and be a part of this retreat!
