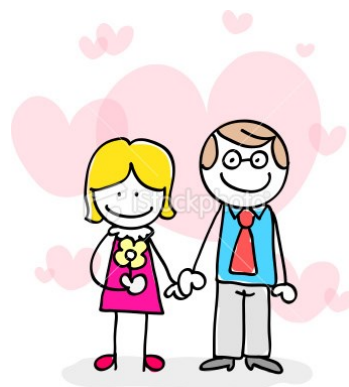

SUPPLIES FOR THE D.R. NEEDED NEXT WEEKEND

It is hard to believe that we will be leaving for the D.R. in twelve days—and packing for the trip after Masses next weekend! We have eleven parishioners who are heading down to the Dominican Republic from January 15–23. As always, we have been asked by the Sisters to bring with us diapers, first-aid supplies, and over-the-counter medicines for use in the Portal de Belén. We also try to bring clothes that can be distributed to the children at the school. We invite you to purchase a few things for the D.R. Children's summer clothes are needed for ages 1–12; gently used clothes are fine as well. Size 3 diapers are most useful to the Sisters. Donations can be placed at the doorways or by the baptismal font on the west side of the Church.

ADULT TRIP TO THE DOMINICAN REPUBLIC

On January 15, eleven members of our community will be embarking on a trip to visit the Portal de Belén and the Missionary Sisters of Jesus community in the Dominican Republic. The group will be returning on January 23. The trip will include the opportunity to spend a few days with the children at the Portal, visit with the Sisters and the lay missionary community in both Monte Plata and Nagua, check in with the 200 Club projects from years past, and get to know the daily workings of the Portal better. We are also going to try to be of service to the Portal by giving eye tests to the children, since it was noticeable last year that none of the children wear glasses. DIOCESAN PUBLIC POLICY COMMITTEE

Children are God's gift to the world. Let's make good choices for children. In a 2005 study, 73 percent of women undergoing an abortion said not being able to afford a baby now was a reason for the abortion. That number rose to 81 percent for women below the federal poverty line. And while the abortion rate for American women declined by 8 percent between 2000 and 2008, among poor American women it increased by 18 percent. Providing child care subsidies eases the financial burden of raising children and may reduce the number of abortions. Our Diocesan Public Policy Committee will be asking you to advocate for increased funding for child care subsidies on February 6-7 during Masses.

"IN THE LOOP" WITH THE HIGH SCHOOL YOUTH MINISTRY

This Sunday the High School Youth Ministry meeting will be a mother/daughter service project that will take place at All Saints Church in Lansing for the organization Days for Girls. The high schoolers and their mothers will be working to put together personal hygiene kits for girls around the world. The following Sunday, January 10, the high schoolers will be gathering to watch the movie *The Mission*. This movie is set in 18th century South America and tells the story of Jesuit missionaries there.

MIDDLE SCHOOL YOUTH MINISTRY

We have two sessions this Sunday for our middle schoolers. Girls and their mothers are invited to join our high school girls and their mothers at All Saints Church in Lansing during the session time to put together personal hygiene kits for girls around the world through the organization Days for Girls. For our boys or any girls who would rather come to the Parish Center, the MSYM session will focus on youth-led advocacy. During this session, the young people will learn that a penny a day from Americans could end world hunger in eight years. This session is designed to give the middle schoolers a chance to create posters, fliers, and other resources to help raise awareness within the parish community. They can also discuss ways to organize events for this cause, such as a penny drive. Ashley Blank will be at the Days for Girls event and Kate Mackenzie will be leading the session at the Parish Center.
