From the Book of Ann Marie

Dear Parish Family,

As we enter into summer, our bulletin will be getting smaller, so my "Book of Ann Marie" will go on hiatus for a few months. I will genuinely miss this little opportunity to talk to you. I greatly appreciate the interesting conversations I have with people about the things I write — those of you who affirm, disagree, add insight, and otherwise react to this space make me a better minister and person.

A few things to share before the hiatus begins:

- 1. As many of you know, I purchased a house last August and began bringing it back to life with the help of some of you and my family, some really good local contractors and companies, and a lot of my own elbow grease. That has included replacing almost everything you can think of (except the roof, knock on wood!), gutting and replacing the bathroom and kitchen, painting every surface, inside and out, scrubbing off years of dirt (and mildew and mold), and beginning the task of bringing the lawns and gardens back to life. There was so much work that I didn't move in until just before Christmas and I just recently finished the last touches to the inside. There is still structural work to do in the back of the house, the basement is a mess, and it will take me years to get the lot into good shape, but if I wait until it is perfect I will never get to share it with you. So, I hope you will be able to come and share this journey with me. I am having an Open House on Sunday, July 3, from 1-8 p.m. Come right after Mass if you like, or stop by sometime during the afternoon or evening. I will have some snacks and drinks to share and you are welcome to stay for as long or as short as you like. There is no need to bring anything; just come and say hello and see what I have been working on for almost a year. I live at 22 Dart Drive in Ithaca. If you are gone that weekend, I will try to do this again sometime in the fall.
- 2. It was a pleasure to meet the bishop and his secretary, Fr. White. I have been in the same place with both of them on numerous occasions, but never meet them. I found Bishop Matano to be very warm personally and very excited about our new Parish Center and the opportunities it will provide for our parish in the future. I appreciated how long he stayed at the reception, especially knowing it is a two-hour drive back to Rochester. Now we just need to teach him how to say "Marcoux" (coming from Rhode Island, he says it without the "r"—"Mah-coux"!). And I have to let you know that Fr. White was great with our altar servers. He explained things really well, and was funny and nonthreatening to our kids who were a little nervous about serving at this big Mass. He is very good at his job!
- 3. The parish picnic last Sunday was also a great experience. As someone said to me, "It is a very chill event!" He meant it as a compliment meaning it is free, simple, and not stressful. There are a few games for the kids, but mostly they just chased each other around the field and made up seemingly rule-less games with the balls. Our teens played some Frisbee and hung out together. Groups of adults sat around talking and sharing stories and a few families played some board games. There was enough food for everyone to have a good lunch and plenty of desserts, perhaps too many for those of you with kids who went home a little sugared up! The band played some great music and helped us do the limbo and a few other group activities. It is all possible because the good work of the Welcoming and Social Committee. It is also possible because people showed up to set up on Saturday and Sunday, and just enough hands stayed or came to help with cleanup and take-down at the end of the picnic. I truly love that during my almost four years here at St. Catherine's there has only been one time when we didn't get the people we needed to do the work of a parish event and that was more weather-related than anything else. That's a great track record! It matches Fr. Joe's "baby-whispering" skills. In those same almost four years, only one baby has cried during a baptism. Pretty impressive!

If you don't see me at the 5 p.m. Mass this week it is because my friend and colleague Sr. Eileen McCann is celebrating her 50th Jubilee as a Sister of St. Joseph and I will be with her up in Albany celebrating! I assume I will also spend the day with Sr. Mary O'Brien, since Eileen and Mary were classmates in grade school and high school. It is a small world! I will try to get back in time for Mass, but I hate to leave a good party too early!
