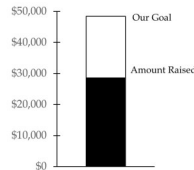

## Parish-Wide Opportunities

### LEARN ABOUT THE BIBLE

The New Testament—the Gospels, Acts of the Apostles, Letters, and Book of Revelation—are at the heart of our faith. They tell us who Jesus is, what he did, and how his life, death, and resurrection transformed the world. Knowing what is in the Bible, and how it all works together, can help us better understand God's plan for our salvation. St. Catherine's Scripture Study for January/February is called Panorama of the New Testament and, over the course of five weeks, it will introduce you more fully to all of these writings. The study will be held on Monday nights **beginning on January 9 and continuing until February 6** from 7-8:30 p.m. in the Parish Center. The cost for the books is \$20 and they can be purchased on January 9 at the first meeting. This study is designed for everyone—those who know almost nothing about the Bible and those who know a lot. All are welcome.

### WORKSHOP FOR PARENTS

Michael Theisen, a well-known speaker and workshop presenter (and former Director of Youth Ministry for the Diocese of Rochester) will be here at St. Catherine's on **January 27-28** to talk to parents.



Research on young people and faith has been very clear about the most powerful force in shaping their developing faith—their parents. Children reflect the faith of their parents and the practices

learned and shared within the home. Let's come together as parents and talk about what this means and what practices have the biggest impact, and explore some suggestions for taking the next steps in growing deeper in faith at home. The Friday workshop will include dinner from 6-7 p.m., followed by the workshop until 9 p.m. Saturday morning's workshop will include morning hospitality and will run from 9-11 a.m. Babysitting is available during both of these sessions for those who register at least one week in advance. 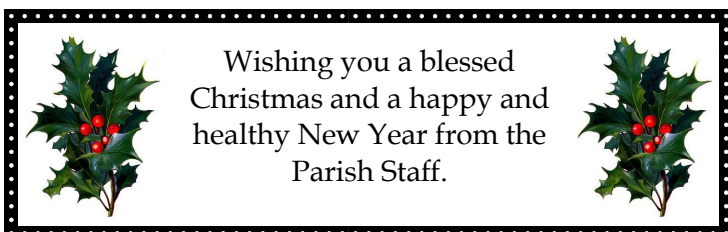

## Youth Faith Formation

### "IN THE LOOP" WITH THE HIGH SCHOOL YOUTH MINISTRY

High School Youth Ministry will *not* gather the weekends of December 25 and January 1. We will resume on January 8 with a session exploring the effects of the Second Vatican Council. Youth will get an introduction into how the Council came about, the main themes, and how it has impacted today's Church with a view to the future. We may also have a guest speaker come in and provide a witness talk about their experiences with the Church pre-Vatican II and after.

### MIDDLE SCHOOL YOUTH MINISTRY

Middle School Youth Ministry will *not* gather the weekends of December 25 and January 1. We will resume on January 8 with a session themed around Natural Law. During this time, the participants will be introduced to the "origin" of Natural Law and its role in living a Gospel life. This is a Confirmation topic and is a required session for our Confirmation candidates.

### NO SESSIONS DECEMBER 25 OR JANUARY 1

Our faith formation programs for children and youth (CLOW, CFF, MSYM, HSYM) will *not* meet on December 25 and January 1. We hope this will allow families to spend time together and enjoy the holiday season. All sessions will resume on Sunday, January 8.

### CFF WHOLE GROUP SESSION JANUARY 8

Our children in grades 1-6 will participate in a Whole Group Session on January 8 focusing on refugees. We will introduce the term *refugees* to the children and will discuss how our faith asks us to reach out to the poor and vulnerable to provide everyone with dignity. The children will listen to the story "Four Feet, Two Sandals" about two young girls living in a refugee camp in Peshawar and will then gather in their grade groups to make two different crafts: Peace Pins to sell to the community to raise money for Catholic Charities Immigrant Services and no-sew fleece hats for the new refugee families coming to Ithaca.

### FIRST EUCHARIST PARENT MEETING

There will be an informational meeting on **Wednesday, January 4, at 6 p.m.** for parents whose children are ready to receive the Sacrament of First Eucharist. Any child in third grade or older who has received the Sacrament of Reconciliation and is ready to receive the Sacrament of First Eucharist is able to do so. ## FROM THE BOOK OF JOE

Dear Parish Family,

Now, more than ever, I believe we need to hear a message of hope!

I can only hope for something if I believe that it will come true someday. What is it that we disciples hope for? Nothing less than eternal life with God! This hope began with the seemingly insignificant birth of a materially impoverished child some two thousand years ago. That was only the beginning, but we celebrate the beginning. And it began with a message from an angel: the angel declared that “unto us a child is given” –unto *us*! Not to Mary and Joseph but to us, to all of humanity. Yes, Mary and Joseph provided him with an environment where he could grow in wisdom and knowledge and love. They instilled their values into him: kindness, compassion, forgiveness, and mercy. And when he became an adult, he taught us a way to live life.

I think sometimes, because of the hype around this season, and especially because of our recent election, we’ve lost sight of the thing we hope for—union with our Creator. We have a mission in this world: to proclaim that an infant was born who changed everything—who gave us hope and helped us to see that there is more to this life than our own petty maneuvers. We live in the world, but we are not of the world. The things of this world cannot save us, cannot give us what we hope for—eternal life. Consequently, we do not regard current events as definite reality. Lately, I’ve been a bit fixated on our political landscape (and I do not think I am alone), but I do believe that I’ve lost sight of the endgame. Thank God he came to restore sight to the blind.

I’m not saying that what’s happening in our politics is not important—it is. But I am also saying that in Jesus’ time the politics were quite a bit worse, and he was more concerned with the poor than he was about the Romans. I’m not saying we don’t have to be engaged and use our prophetic voice—we do. I’m just saying that we cannot lose sight of the poor while we are speaking out. Recently, I have witnessed normally reasonable people totally freaking out, completely out of character for them. While I will be the first to say that we must never be silent in the face of injustice, I will also remind myself and others that we do not control the conclusion of this story. It is a little arrogant to think that we are in total control. The only thing that we are in control of is ourselves; with that in mind, we should stop trying to force others to change. That never works. Rather, we should concentrate on changing ourselves and show the other that there is another way—a way of peace and love. That is after all what this little child grew up to teach us. I think we, as a race, are pretty slow learners, but it’s not too late. I do wish you all a very Merry Christmas, but my prayer is that what began in a tiny little manger will transform the world because it transformed you.

## PEACE PINS 14850 TO SUPPORT REFUGEES

During the weekend of January 14/15 after all of the Masses, we will be offering Peace Pins for a free-will donation. Peace Pins 14850 is a private group of people in Ithaca, including some of our own St. Catherine's parishioners, who want to embrace the refugee families arriving in Ithaca this coming year. To do so, they are raising funds by selling red, white, and blue beaded safety pins as a communal rejection of bigotry and discrimination. One hundred percent of the donated money will go to Catholic Charities of Tompkins and Tioga County, who will use it to support these families directly. Their hope is that the Peace Pins will be a symbol of your solidarity and compassion for them and for everyone. Our children in grades 1-6 will be making some of the Peace Pins during their whole group session focused on the theme of refugees on January 8.

## ADVENT GIFT-GIVING PROJECT—ST. JUDE

Throughout Advent, the children and youth in grades 1 through High School Youth Ministry have been collecting money to purchase events, supplies, and treatments as gifts for St. Jude Children's Research Hospital. During the middle of November, each class chose a specific gift that they worked to purchase. We are incredibly proud to say that our faith formation children and youth raised a total of \$811.96 and were able to purchase 15 gifts for this amazing organization. This amount is \$111.96 more than the anticipated goal of \$700, so we were able to purchase two more gifts for this hospital of hope. Below are the gifts and the amount each class purchased:

- MSYM: Rehab Weights, No Mo' Chemo Party, and Video Games for Teen Rooms —\$125
- HSYM: Share of One Day of Oxygen and No Mo' Chemo Party —\$100
