THE NEW PARISH CENTER IS OPEN!

Many of you have already had the chance to walk through the new Parish Center on your way into Church or because you stopped by to check out the new space. The reaction to the building has been universally positive. It is quite beautiful, very user friendly, and will serve our needs well for many, many years to come.

The staff officially moved into the new building this past week, and we and many volunteers are doing the slow but important work of unpacking, sorting, and storing the “stuff” of our parish. We have made good progress on many parts of the Parish Center, although our office furniture didn’t arrive until Friday, so it will be a little while before our offices are unpacked and fully operational. We trust that you will be a little patient with us as we figure everything out and appreciate that the many groups using the Parish Center have been very accommodating as we have lived through this transition.

Many thanks to Bill Perkins and the many men and women who came to help with the move on Monday, and the many people who helped pack up the old Parish Center over the course of many months, particularly Marion Krohn, who was key to much of that work.



We will officially dedicate the new Parish Center on the Feast Day of St. Catherine of Siena, April 29, at the 5 p.m. Mass, followed by a reception. Bishop Matano will be with us for these celebrations, and we have a week’s worth of events to help us dedicate this building and our work together. We hope you will put this date in your calendar now so that you can be here for the dedication!

If you are wondering about the old Parish Center, here is what we know. Finger Lakes ReUse was here this past week to take anything out of the building that they could use. There isn’t much left! The abatement will begin on February 20 and should last for two weeks. A parishioner is then going to remove all the windows from the building to make a greenhouse, and then the building will be demolished and removed. This spring, that area and the rest of our property will be landscaped, the new parking spaces will be added, and the temporary parking area will be restored to grass. It will obviously be a while before everything grows in, but by the end of the summer, we should arrive at our new normal.

If you haven’t been over to the new building, please come and see what we have built together!

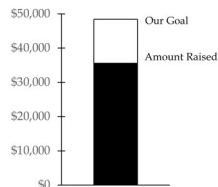

200 CLUB

We are really excited to open up ticket sales for the 200 Club Dinner to our whole parish. The 200 Club began thirteen years ago to raise money for special projects in the D.R. that couldn't be covered by our regular, ongoing donations at the doors of our Church. In the past, the 200 Club has raised about \$12,000 a year that has helped to buy a bus for the school, dig new wells, build latrines, send girls to college, pay for salaries, and many other projects for the Portal de Belén and for the greater Monte Plata area. This year we continue to help the Missionary Sisters of Jesus purchase land adjacent to the school so that the Portal de Belén can expand.

FROM THE BOOK OF ANN MARIE

Dear Parish Family,

We got great news on Tuesday from Catholic Charities – a family from Afghanistan will be the first to arrive through the Refugee Reception and Placement program here in Ithaca.

The press release included this information:

Sue Chaffee, Director of Catholic Charities Immigrant Services Program, said, “This family is entering the U.S. under the Special Immigrant Visa (SIV) program for people who were employed by or on behalf of the United States government in Afghanistan or Iraq. The rigorous process of obtaining SIV status is administered by the U.S. State Department, which issues these visas in very limited numbers. This is a different immigration status than people who have been vetted and designated as refugees by the United Nations High Commission on Refugees.

However, once these SIV holders enter the U.S., they are welcomed and oriented to life in this country through refugee resettlement agencies like ours. In order to respect the privacy of this family, and in recognition of the upheaval and trauma they have experienced, we are not going to make their name, address, or further details about them available to the public. However we have been working closely with the Ithaca School District, local physicians’ offices, the local grassroots community organization Ithaca Welcomes Refugees, and others to help ensure this family will have a warm welcome and a smooth transition to our community.”



The press release also included the information that they don’t have any idea if they will get any additional refugees in the coming months, but they are committed to continuing to work with the many refugees and immigrants who are already our neighbors as well as any new families who come.

Postcard Update: St. Catherine’s helped write and secure over 700 postcards for the “Ithaca Wants Refugees” campaign that I initiated after President Trump’s Executive Order was signed on January 27. Our efforts were matched by those in our community such that we mailed 2,557 postcards to the White House and another 100 or so to other political leaders on February 8. It was inspiring to read some of these cards, written by children as young as 3, some very eloquent teenagers, former refugees and immigrants, veterans, people of all political parties, and members of our clergy. As Laurie Konwinski from Catholic Charities and I were gathering up the postcards to head to the Post Office, I commented that I knew that writing the postcards probably wouldn’t change President Trump’s mind on this issue. In response, she told me a great story from history:

In the midst of the Vietnam War, A. J. Muste, a political activist, stood outside the White House every night holding a candle. When he was confronted with the truth that his protest was not changing the world, his response was that he did not stand outside the White House to change the world; he stood there to ensure that the world didn’t change him.

In reading some of the postcards, one of the things I recognized is that this campaign gave all of us who participated an opportunity to name our truths – to speak to what is most important to us and to reaffirm the values we try to live by and the ones we want our country to live by as well.

Thanks for your continuing prayers and support for refugees around the world, as well as the family that will be arriving in our area in the coming weeks. “Welcome the stranger” has always been a part of our faith tradition, and yet I feel more connected to it now than ever before.

Please accept our sincerest thanks for your generosity and please also continue to follow the brave work of our staff and volunteers who are making such a difference to so many lives in Greece and Jordan.
