ADVENT RECONCILIATION SERVICE

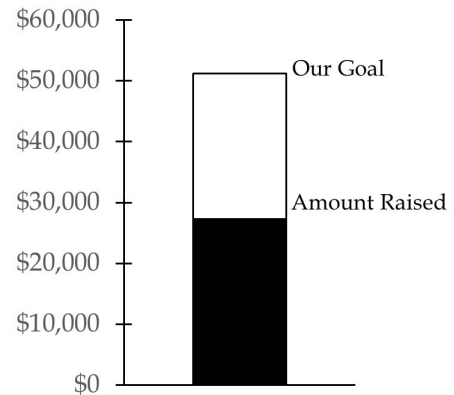

**FROM THE BOOK OF ANN MARIE**

Dear Parish Family,

This weekend, at all the Masses, you will have the chance to help install our new liturgical ministers and commission those who have been doing these ministries for a long time. We haven't done this at St. Catherine's for a while, but during this Year of the Eucharist, it is important to pay special attention to those who help us celebrate Mass together.

We are very blessed to have so many faithful people who serve in these ministries. If you ask them, they will tell you of the blessings they receive while ministering to our community through the ministries of Lector, Hospitality Minister, Eucharistic Minister, Altar Servers, and Sacristan. We, of course, are blessed by their ministry as well. (I also want to acknowledge that our Cantors and Music Ministers are a key part of our liturgical ministry team as well, but since we just blessed them on the Feast of St. Cecilia, we won't be doing that this weekend!)

One of the reasons we wanted to install and commission our liturgical ministers in such a public way this year is to invite the rest of the community to consider volunteering for one of these ministries. Liturgical Ministers are not required to be perfect, but are people who are striving to live their lives in accordance with the Scriptures and in line with Catholic teaching. Each of our ministers takes their responsibility very seriously, and I believe you can tell that is true because of the quality of our liturgies.

Perhaps God is inviting you to take a step toward greater involvement in our liturgy by serving in one of these roles. This would be a great thing to pray about! Please spend a little time praying about how God might be calling you into one of these ministries, and if and when you are ready to volunteer, please contact Patricia Sipple at patricia.sipple@dor.org or 257-2493.

Here is a little information about each of them:

- *Altar Server*: Serve at weekend or holy day Mass, helping the priest on the altar. All who have received First Communion are welcome.
- *Eucharistic Minister*: Distribute Communion at weekend or holy day Mass, and/or to the sick and homebound. Eucharistic Ministers must be Confirmed and at least 17 years old.
- *Hospitality Minister*: Arrive 15 minutes prior to weekend or holy day Mass to greet people as they arrive, distribute MagnifiKid materials and bulletins, and assist people in need. All ages are welcome, and families are encouraged to serve together.
- *Lector*: Proclaim the Scriptures at weekend or holy day Mass. All ages are welcome.
- *Weekend Sacristan*: Arrive 25 minutes prior to weekend Mass to set up for Mass and assist with cleanup after Mass. Serve each week or on a rotating schedule with other sacristans.

For each of these roles, you can request weekends off when you won't be available, and you can serve at the Mass you regularly attend. We use an online ministry scheduling program that also lets you request a sub if you can't serve at the last minute. Schedules are done on a three-month basis, so you know well in advance when you are scheduled. Training is required for each of these roles and is provided twice a year by our coordinators for each liturgical role.

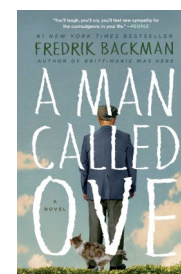
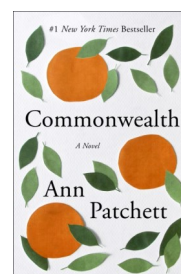
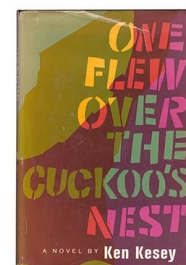
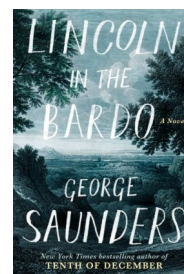
ST. CATHERINE'S BOOK CLUB 2018 TITLES

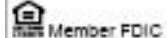
