SUMMER LEADERSHIP WORKSHOPS

Last summer we launched a week of leadership training here at St. Catherine's. More than forty people took advantage of one or more of the workshops, learning more about themselves as well as important leadership skills and concepts. This year we will provide four new leadership workshops that are open to anyone and everyone—high school age and above, St. Catherine's parishioners and beyond.

The workshops will be held **July 9–12 from 6:30–9 p.m.** and will be led by Ann Marie Eckert. Individuals are welcome to come to any or all of the workshops as each will be a unique topic. There is no cost for the workshops, but advance registration is very helpful. Here are the topics for this year:

- **July 9—How to lead and be a part of groups.** Most people in today's world find themselves working in groups—at school, in the office, here at Church, and within the community. This workshop will provide a fun activity to learn more about the basic things that need to happen in a group, and then you will have the opportunity to lead a discussion to practice your own skills for leading.
- **July 10—Being proactive.** Many of us respond to things in very reactive ways, and we end up feeling victimized by others. But we can choose how we respond *proactively* to the situations that we find ourselves in. This concept can make a huge difference in dealing with difficult people, health challenges, disappointments in our personal and work lives, and more.
- **July 11—How to give a good presentation.** There are those who love to speak in front of people and those who hate it, but few of us get out of life without needing to do so occasionally. Like anything in life, there are things that you can learn to make it easier to tell a good joke, make a speech, give a presentation, or give a talk about your faith life. This workshop will give you practical ideas, but won't make you speak in front of the group—so don't worry about that!
- **July 12—How to get, keep, and hand off tasks to volunteers.** This may not be a skill that everyone needs, but for those who work as a volunteer or with volunteers, there are a lot of things that we can do to make it easier, more efficient, and most important, more fun for those who volunteer their time. This workshop will give practical skills for ways to engage new people, ways to get them oriented and involved, and ways to move them into engaged leadership within your organization.

TENEBRAE: THE PASSION OF DIETRICH BONHOEFFER

Sage Chapel on Cornell's Campus will be hosting a new piece of music by composer Huge McElyea, titled "Tenebrae: The Passion of Dietrich Bonhoeffer" on **Saturday, June 16, at 8 p.m.** There is no cost for this event. Bonhoeffer is remembered as the Lutheran pastor who spoke out against the Nazi regime on the day Adolf Hitler came to power. The title "Tenebrae" is from the Latin phrase *Tenebrae factae sunt*, meaning "When darkness covered the earth." The ritual setting of this drama is patterned after the fourth-century monastic service of Tenebrae. Twelve candles are extinguished one by one as the Gospel account of the Passion is read, until the church is left in total darkness.

**FROM THE BOOK OF ANN MARIE**

Dear Parish Family,

This week we began the planning for the Silent Auction at the Ithaca Peace Festival. You may not realize this, but much of the money that is made at this event actually comes through the auction, so it is a really important part of the overall success of the festival. I am really excited that we have some new volunteers for this committee – because new people always bring new ideas and energy. For example, last year while eating a bagel at Ithaca Bakery with a group of people, I asked for ideas for the auction, and among other things, they came up with the idea for the pew raffle for Easter and Christmas – which was super successful and fun!

So many people say they hate asking for donations, and yet this is one of those events where people can help much more than they realize. Here's what I mean: Last year I got a really pretty plate for Christmas – something that I am sure cost a lot of money. It is really nice, and I will never use it. I put it in the basement with my "things for the auction" shelf. Also on the shelf is a beautiful handmade pottery bowl that my mom had that just didn't fit in her new house. One of the members of our committee last year used her coupons from Bon Ton to purchase wine glasses for a song, and then donated them (and a few bottles of wine) to the auction. I'm thinking Kohl's Cash might be spent on something like that, too! Some people have a ton of fun putting together a movie basket, baking basket, or a holiday basket, and then they donate it to the auction. Other members of our community donate something they know how to do – two members donate pies, to be delivered throughout the year. Jessica and Joe Ryan were just posting on Facebook how good their pie was this past weekend – one of the pies they won at the auction last year. Fr. Joe makes dinner, Sherry teaches people to sing, and I have donated pottery lessons (that still haven't happened – yikes!). I don't know what you can do, but you might be surprised how people might want what you have to offer: dog walking, hair styling, cake baking, tour guiding, grocery shopping.

And then, of course, there are the donations from community businesses. These are also really important to the Silent Auction, and not as hard to get as you might think. One of our members is fearless in asking for donations. If she is eating at a restaurant, she asks if they might donate a gift certificate. When she is shopping at a store, she asks if they might donate an item. Most of these places are businesses that she patronizes all the time, so they are happy to donate. Your gym might donate if you ask. The person who cuts your hair, your favorite winery, the place you golf – all of these businesses might donate, but we have to ask. If everyone who has a long-term relationship with a business asks, we will be overflowing with donations.

The Silent Auction Committee will go out to all the places that have donated in the past, and all the obvious places. That's our job, and we are happy to do it. (And we don't need everyone who eats at Ciao to ask them for a donation!) I am just wondering if you might consider joining in through your own donation or by asking for a donation from a small business that you already have a good relationship with. (I can give you a donation request letter that you can keep in the car just in case you get up the nerve to ask!) You can also ask friends and neighbors if they might like to donate anything – a service, an item, or a gift card they won't be using. The more items we have, the more money we make – and all that money goes to support organizations in our area that work to promote peace in the world and to help St. Catherine's in our ministry and work.

If none of this sounds like anything you want to be a part of, no worries. There are a lot of ways you can support the festival this year: donate a baked good, help us set up, volunteer for a two-hour shift (or more) during the festival, invite friends and neighbors to come for a great night of music, buy raffle tickets, bring your family, serve on one of our committees. As we head into summer, please know that there is a big group of parishioners who are working regularly and steadily throughout the summer to bring the festival to life. Thanks for any help you can offer, and we look forward to a great weekend of music, food, games, and peace-building – September 7-9, 2018!
