

It means liberation from bondage, homecoming, life rather than death, sight to the blind, healing of the wounds of existence—and in general healing the human condition. FROM THE BOOK OF ANN MARIE

Dear Parish Family,

This is recycling week on my block, and my two bins are overflowing. There is some paper and some cans, but most of it is plastic: yogurt containers, milk jugs, shampoo bottles, laundry detergent bottles, and on and on.

I have become more conscious of my recycling because I recently watched a short video

about what happens to our plastics when they are recycled. Did you know that since 1950 (when we started using plastics), only about 9 percent of all plastics have been recycled? Some have been incinerated (putting lots of chemicals into our air), but about 60 percent of every plastic container produced is still on our planet, and far too many are in our water. An international team of researchers found that the Great Pacific Garbage Patch, a collection of floating plastic trash (located halfway between Hawaii and California) has grown to more than 600,000 square miles, or twice the size of Texas. I also recently learned that the Pacific Garbage Patch isn't the only one! It is the largest, but there are four other patches in our oceans. Because these patches are formed by winds and currents and are in international waters, no country has taken responsibility for cleaning them up, so it falls to nonprofits to try to take on this work. Here's something else: Did you know that about 50 percent of what we put in our recycling bins doesn't actually get recycled? That's because recycling has to be sold, and if no one wants to buy it, it ends up in our landfills.

One of the reasons I was thinking about this so much is because December is the time of year when I am most likely to go out shopping and come home with tons and tons of plastic. I am pretty good about bringing my reusable shopping bags to Tops, but I don't think of it when I am out Christmas shopping, so I end up with 15 plastic bags after a day of shopping. Then there are all those things we buy that are packaged in that hard plastic "wrapping" — the kind you need scissors and a strong hand just to break into. Most of the toys you can buy today are plastic. A trip to Bath and Body Works will fill your house with plastic. The stop at McDonalds for a soda only adds to the problem! And then there are water bottles. When we live in a country where, with few exceptions, our water is clean and almost free, why are we buying it in plastic bottles that are overwhelming our planet?

Pope Francis wrote his encyclical *Laudato Si* about care for the environment a few years ago. One of his biggest points is that the poor suffer the most from the destruction of the planet and from the waste of the rich. All of our garbage ends up in landfills, which are usually located in poorer areas. Our recycling is packaged and sold and then usually shipped to a developing country. Until recently it was shipped to China, but they have stopped accepting plastics because the rate of global imports grew 723 percent from 1993 to 2016 and they cannot take any more. Much of this growth is caused by single use containers (drinking cups, water bottles, coffee cup lids, straws, and so on).

As I was writing, I was thinking about what it would be like if every plastic thing we purchase or otherwise bring into our houses needed to stay there forever. Imagine it! Imagine if we just needed to keep a year's worth of our plastics in our houses forever. We would go crazy trying to figure out where to keep them! The luxury that we have as people who live in one of the richest countries in the world is that our waste ends up in someone else's house. It ends up in poor rural communities in our own country, and much of it is shipped off to poor countries who are trying to figure out how to recycle it without overwhelming their own land, environment, and society.

I know that there are a million things to worry about right now, but this one thing—reducing our use of plastics—seems like it is a little easier than some of the other things on the "worry list." And even if it isn't easier, it is really important. Let's all try a little harder to reduce, instead of just recycling.




St. Catherine's Book Club 2019 Titles






KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS POSTER CONTEST
