ST. CATHERINE'S D.R. CLUB

Lots of people buy scratch-off lottery tickets for friends and family during the holidays because the thrill of winning is fun! You and your friends and family can get that same thrill through the D.R. Club because each ticket has the chance to be chosen on each and every day of 2019. And


every time your ticket is chosen, you will receive a check for \$25! All of that would be fun on its own, but the D.R. Club provides something that a scratch-off ticket never can—the knowledge that you are helping to educate, feed, and form 300 children in Monte Plata, Dominican Republic. Each ticket to the D.R. Club helps to provide the money needed to take care of the smallest of the children, those in the nursery, pre-K, and kindergarten. Here is how it works: You purchase a ticket for \$25. That ticket goes into the “hat,” and on January 30 we will pull the winners for the year. If your ticket wins, it goes right back into the “hat” so you can continue to win over and over again. January’s winners will be announced on February 2 in the bulletin, and after that each week’s winners will be announced in the bulletin. But you don’t have to read the bulletin to see if you are a winner, because the other way you will find out is that a check for \$25 will arrive in your mailbox each time you win. Throughout 2019, checks will be mailed weekly to all the winners for that week. Tickets will not be on sale after the Christmas Masses, but we will continue to sell the tickets through January 27.

**FROM THE BOOK OF ANN MARIE**

Dear Parish Family,

Merry Christmas! Today we celebrate the birth of Jesus, the incarnation, the Son of God who dwells among us. We celebrate a God who so loved the world that he sent his Son to be with us. Love is at the heart of Christmas, the starting point for our relationship with God the Creator, God the Son, and God the Spirit.

Here at St. Catherine's we have spent the Advent season preparing our hearts for this Christmas celebration by focusing on gratitude. Love and hope came into the world in a new way when Jesus was born, but it continues to come into the world when you and I pour love, hope, and light into the world.

The first week of Advent we were asked to think about the things in our lives and the world that give us hope. Those hopes were written on gold and silver paper. Our hopes were broad and powerful – we find hope in our children, the community, people who stand up for justice in the world, Jesus, political activism, new colleagues at work, and a million other hopes. Each of those hopes sits in front of the ambo where the Word of God is proclaimed, shining light into the world.

The second week of Advent we were asked to think about the people who helped us grow in faith. These names were written on the ornament balls that hang over our heads in church. It was amazing to read the names – moms and dads, grandparents, aunts and uncles, siblings, parish priests and religious sisters, members of our own community and pastoral staff, friends. Some balls have one name on it, others are covered in names. One parishioner asked for a second ornament when he couldn't fit all the names on one! As we gather in church for the Christmas season, we have a whole communion of saints – living and dead – gathered with us. These are the people who have passed on the greatest gift to us – a love of Jesus, a place at the Eucharistic table, salvation.

The third week of Advent we were asked to think about the gifts and talents we have received from God that we use for the good of others. These gifts were written on pieces of fabric, which now make up the poinsettias on our altar cloth. Parishioners wrote about being good listeners, practicing patience, spending time with someone who is struggling, baking, having intelligence, teaching, loving, and hundreds of other gifts they recognize within themselves. At least one person wrote "I don't have any," which is a moment for the rest of us to recognize how important it is to affirm and recognize the giftedness in others. At every Mass we offer our gifts to God – not just the bread and wine and financial donations that are brought to the altar, but ourselves as well. This is why our gifts and talents are at the altar this Christmas season.

The fourth week of Advent we were asked to think about the amazing things that God has done through us. This is a hard thing for many people to think about, because we don't often think of ourselves as amazing. And yet we have brought children into the world, taught a little person to tie their shoes, created new understandings through research, volunteered in ways that make life better for others, helped a friend, prayed for a miracle, loved. All of these amazing acts of God, done through our hands and hearts, are written on the ribbon that is in the garland that surrounds our community during Mass. It helps us remember that God is continuing to act in the world through our very lives. This is what we mean when we say that we are the Body of Christ.

We hope that these reflection questions helped those gathered to prepare their hearts and minds for this joyous celebration of Christmas. We also hope that these physical representations of our gratitude, in colorful cloth, ribbon, shining paper, and ornament balls, give all who celebrate with us a glimpse at the joy we have found in our relationship with God and within our church. When it is time to take down the Christmas decorations, here at church and in our homes, I hope that our sense of hopefulness and gratitude won't get packed away. Jesus is the light of the world. We are called to be that light as well.
