SHARING CHRIST



FROM THE BOOK OF JONATHAN LUNINE

Jonathan Lunine is a St. Catherine's parishioner and member of the Pastoral Council. He is the David C. Duncan Professor in the Physical Sciences and Chair of the Department of Astronomy at Cornell.

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

I had just finished giving a presentation on science and faith at the Knights of Columbus chapter in Auburn last January when a woman walked up to me and said she wished she'd heard it earlier. Her son couldn't square what was in Genesis with what he was learning in his science classes. She didn't have an answer, and was afraid he was now abandoning his faith.

Many of our young people lose their faith when they try to confront what they read in the Bible with the scientific discoveries of the 20th century. And, sadly, science teachers sometimes encourage students to do so, out of ignorance or malice toward religion. As Catholics, we have a responsibility to be informed, so that when our children or others have questions about science and faith, we have answers. In this column I want to give quick answers to three questions: (1) Does Biblical inerrancy require that the Bible reflect 21st century scientific knowledge? (2) Is the Church at war with science? (3) Can one be a faithful Catholic *and* be a scientist today?

- 1. The Bible is the inspired, inerrant word of God transmitted through writers who lived a long time ago. Each of them had a worldview shaped by the knowledge and thought of his or her time. Pope Benedict XVI wrote in a catechism for World Youth Day in 2011, "The authors [of the Bible] were children of their time. They shared the ideas of their cultural environment and sometimes were also held back by its errors." But the central biblical message of humankind's relationship to, and salvation through, God, is not dependent on scientific facts about the physical world. The 20th century Catholic priest and physicist Georges Lemaitre said: "Once you realize that the Bible does not purport to be a textbook of science, the old controversy between religion and science vanishes. ... If the theory of relativity had ... been necessary for salvation, it would have been revealed to Saint Paul or to Moses."
- 2. The trial of Galileo is always trotted out when arguing that the Catholic Church is opposed to science. But this affair is both badly described by modern writers and an exception to the Church's long support, explicitly and implicitly, for science. Many of the scientists who made fundamental contributions to science over the centuries were faithful Catholics to the end of their lives (including Galileo). And the Catholic Church explicitly supports scientific research and education today through organizations as diverse as the Vatican astronomy group, Catholic universities, and the Pontifical Academy of Science.
- 3. Detractors of religion often claim that, despite the lengthy list of scientists who were openly religious over the centuries, scientists today can't be because science has disproved or cast serious doubt on the existence of God. However, a careful look at the limits of science argues otherwise. Science can tell us how reality the cosmos and everything in it—works and changes over time. Science can't tell us why reality exists, or what the ultimate ground of being (existence) is. As Catholics, we know the answer to those questions through faith. One can go farther—it was the Judeo-Christian belief in an omnipotent and omniscient Creator God that made the idea of immutable physical laws rational in the first place; around 100 A.D., St. Clement wrote to the Corinthian church, "The unsearchable places of abysses, and the indescribable arrangements of the lower world, are restrained by the same laws." To be a scientist and to believe in the Gospel is reasonable, not contradictory, as witnessed to by the 1,100 members of the Society of Catholic Scientists (founded in 2016) and many other scientists who believe in God.

There is much more to say about all this, and I would very much like to continue the discussion in person either in our youth group or adult faith formation. Please let Ann Marie know of your interest at ann.marie.eckert@dor.org.


