How to Pray the TV Mass from Home

Creating a sacred space to reverently watch the mass in your home

Create a prayer altar under your TV or streaming device. Consider setting a crucifix or other sacred art in the prayer space.

Open your bible to the gospel of the day and place it on your "home altar" to remind you that the Word of God is among you. Light a candle to symbolize the beautiful light that shines in the darkness and to help your home resemble the Church.

Set up chairs like a pew to help you engage in the mass and keep you from passively watching from the couch. Get dressed as you normally would when attending mass. Keeping this routine is especially helpful for children.

If you have holy wate at home, bless yourself and your family before you begin the mass.

Take a few moments of silence to transition from the busyness of your home to the sacredness of the mass.

Fully participate by standing, kneeling, sitting and responding according to the rubrics of the Engage in community by having coffee and breakfast with your family after mass or by calling your loved ones to connect.

A Message From the D.R.

Hello Ann Marie: We wish that all our friends from Santa Catalina are well. How is the situation in Ithaca regarding the virus? Here in Monte Plata it is forbidden to be on the streets. Today they closed all shops with the exception of pharmacies and supermarkets. Schools have closed and they are supposed to send food to children weekly. We'll see what happens. For our part, we have distributed rations of what we had left to some children who we know are in a situation of greatest need, especially those who are more than one in our school. The possibility of having classes via the Internet has been raised but that is not possible because few have the possibility. World news scares us. We can only pray and trust God. Here there is very little help from Public Health, this problem is too big for that institution. God help us.

Sr. Iris also let us know that Sr. Teresa and Sr. Nilda (who are both over 60) are staying at home. Sr. Isabel and Sr. Iris are trying to purchase food and collect federal rations in order to send food to the homes of the children each week. The Sisters are all still healthy.

INFORMATION ABOUT OUR RELATIONSHIP WITH THE D.R.

Fr. Joe sent this letter to the parish via the bulletin two weeks ago:

Every year I am required to ask the Bishop if we can take up special collections, like the Buildings and Grounds or Subsidy for our Catholic Schoolchildren collections, as well as our Samaritan Center collection on Ash Wednesday. I also have to ask for permission to collect for the Portal de Belén. In the past, the Bishop has given us permission to do these. However, given the present circumstances with the diocese filing for Chapter 11, all parishes in the diocese will be subjected to scrutiny concerning funds leaving the parish. Therefore, we will no longer be able to collect or send money to the Portal *through the parish*. One of the first things you will notice is that the D.R. Bowls have been removed.

I know this is sad news to hear. Bishop Matano himself expressed his sadness that our collection for the D.R. needed to cease in light of the bankruptcy filing. I too am saddened by this, but I trust that a little inconvenience and change will not end or diminish our support for Monte Plata.

In no way is the diocese saying that we should not maintain a relationship with the Portal. They are just saying that our finances are being scrutinized, and our relationship will have to change because of this new circumstance. We will still maintain our relationship with the Portal. There is no immediate reason for us to discontinue our mission trips. The only change that we will be making is in how the Portal will be funded.

I am currently working with the D.R. Committee to find a way where individuals can continue to financially support the ministry in the Dominican Republic directly. We will continue to update you on how we will move forward.

We have not yet initiated a plan for this need because of the current crisis, but we will. We want to ensure you that we have a reserve of your generous donations that we are sending to the Sisters that will support the Portal de Belén for the months to come.

FROM THE BOOK OF ANN MARIE

Dear Parish Family,

The loss of Holy Week at St. Catherine's is very sad for me. I am sure it is for you, too. The R.C.I.A. team and I have spent the year journeying with 9 individuals—faithful, beautiful souls—each ready and anxious to be received into the Church at the Easter Vigil. I had already reached out to an individual who has had an exceptionally hard year, inviting him to help bring in the cross and hold it for others during our Good Friday service. The Exsultet, the long hymn of praise

sung at the Vigil, has been assigned and rehearsed for weeks now. Fr. Joe, Sherry, and I met weeks ago to get everything in place for Holy Week. But more than all of this, much more in fact, is that for my whole life I have gone to church to join my own parish community, and the universal Church, in these holiest of days. This year that can't happen.

We do have a unique opportunity to join with the diocesan and universal Church by participating in the Masses that will be celebrated during Holy Week from our own Sacred Heart Cathedral with Bishop Matano or even from the Vatican with Pope Francis. Most of us would never choose to go to these places when we could be home at St. Catherine's, but since home isn't available to us, we get to pray with our Bishop (or the Bishop of Rome) via livestreaming.

But let's not sugarcoat this reality. This is a time to mourn our separation. We are choosing not to livestream the Triduum from St. Catherine's because "celebrating" alone, without the community, makes little sense. Until we can celebrate these days together, there is no use trying to create what can't be done without you being there. Whose feet would get washed? Who would hold the cross for veneration? How could we pass over the time when baptisms should be happening at the Vigil as if there were not people longing for these sacraments, yet unable to be present? We just can't do it. This may seem harsh, but I think we need to face this awful reality with the pain it inflicts. We are effectively in exile, and that means unintended suffering.

We will celebrate Mass on Easter Sunday from St. Catherine's, but you won't be there with us—not in person. We will celebrate Christ's resurrection on that day, but with a sense of loss. This experience really does teach all of us what the People of God really means.
