### **UPDATE FROM THE PARISH STAFF**

We are very much looking forward to reopening the church and reconnecting with you again. We know that not everyone can return (due to safety issues) but we are thankful that we can celebrate Mass in community again and will be able to see some of your mask-hidden, yet smiling faces next weekend. We are doing everything we can to make it as safe as possible for you to gather, but we know that gathering anywhere, with anyone, isn't a risk some of you can take. For others, we invite you to consider the option of coming to a weekday Mass where there will be fewer people attending and the Mass will be shorter.



Whether it is sooner or later, we will continue to pray with you via livestream until you are able to come back to church.

As you know, it is imperative that we have volunteers for Hospitality Ministry and Cleaning Crews for our upcoming Masses. Please sign up to help if you can—with a special invitation to those of you who are younger to serve in these positions. This is one of those moments in the life of the Church when we really shouldn't rely on our older parishioners who often are the first to volunteer. Fr. Joe will not reopen the church unless we have adequate coverage.

The parish staff members who were furloughed will be returning to St. Catherine's in August. We are looking forward to being back together and serving the community in new ways through the unusual months ahead. We will be planning for September–December as best we can and will let you know what those plans are in the weeks to come. There will be less happening at the parish, but that gives us an opportunity to really focus our attention on the Sacraments and on faith formation for people of all ages.

We will be opening the Parish Office with limited hours through the summer. We will be open from 9 a.m.-12 p.m. on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday, and from 10 a.m.-1 p.m. on Sunday. We ask that you conduct your parish business during those times. When the office is not open, you can still leave a message on our answering machine or send an email to the parish email (<u>istcate@dor.org</u>) or to a member of the staff.

Again, thank you for all the different ways so many of you have supported the parish during the last three months: with financial donations, by filling out the survey, by sending notes and emails, and through your sharing of St. Catherine's with friends and family. We are so grateful to serve such an amazing parish community!

Fr. Joe will be available for Reconciliation in the Marian Garden on Saturdays from 4–4:50 p.m., weather permitting. Please enter through the Parish Center and wait (socially distancing) in the walkway until he is available.

## HOSPITALITY MINISTERS AND CLEANING CREW MEMBERS STILL NEEDED

In order to open the church, we need people who can help us do it safely. We are still looking for a lot more people who can help us with Hospitality Ministry, as well as a few more for our Cleaning Crews. Please sign up by Monday, June 22, so that we can create a schedule for the coming weeks. Hospitality Ministers are necessary both to welcome people back to church, and also to ensure that people can enter and exit from the church in an organized way. We are looking for 8 people for each Mass to serve in these roles. It will require that you arrive at Mass at least 40 minutes prior to its start. Cleaning Crews are necessary to ensure that our church building will be a safe environment for all who enter. We believe that it will take about 30 minutes to clean the church after each Mass, starting after the church is emptied of people. For each of these ministries, you can volunteer for the Mass you are planning on attending and can do so weekly, biweekly, monthly, or as a sub. Everyone must receive training prior to serving in this role. Training will be provided in the church at a variety of times, on June 26 and 27, and after that time as needed. ### Who's Coming to Livestreamed Church?

We thought you might be interested in knowing that there are about 500 views of our Mass each week. Since we know that not everyone is watching alone, the actual number of people joining us for Mass is probably much higher. Interestingly, we also have people from all over the country joining us—usually from around 25 different states and up to 4 countries, including Canada, Chile, Italy, and Kenya thus far. A few weeks ago we had a good number from Florida (23), Colorado (10), California (7), Maryland (6), Pennsylvania (5), New Jersey (4), and 3 or fewer from Arizona, Arkansas, Connecticut, Illinois, Indiana, Kansas, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, Nevada, New Hampshire, North Carolina, Ohio, Texas, Virginia, and Washington. We assume many of these folks will now be returning to their parishes as churches reopen, but it has been nice to have so many with us through these months.

### St. Catherine of Siena Church Directives for Public Masses beginning June 27, 2020

We are grateful to be able to gather to celebrate the Mass together. We are committed to disinfect and clean the church and the public spaces of the Parish Center in a way that will ensure trust. We are confident that parishioners and visitors will follow all the directions listed here for the safety of all.

### Attendance at Mass:

- No one should come to Mass if they are ill (including the priest and all ministers).
- Bishop Matano has extended the dispensation to attend Sunday Mass until further notice. Therefore, you should not feel obligated to come to the church building. Mass will continue to be livestreamed (5 p.m. on Saturday and 9 and 11:30 a.m. on Sunday, available any time afterward for viewing at <a href="www.tinyurl.com/StCatLivestream">www.tinyurl.com/StCatLivestream</a>.)
- Those who are over the age of 65, those who are vulnerable due to underlying health issues, and those who are caring for others at risk should consider not attending Mass.
- The weekend Mass schedule remains the same: Saturday at 5 p.m.; Sunday at 9 and 11:30 a.m.
- St. Catherine's will celebrate daily Mass on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday at 9 a.m. beginning June 29. (Immaculate Conception will celebrate daily Mass on Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday.)

### **Before Mass Starts:**

- Please plan to arrive at least 20 minutes prior to the start of Mass so that you can be seated in an organized and safe way. No one will be allowed into the church after Mass has begun.
- Everyone (over the age of 2) is required to wear a face mask prior to leaving their car or arriving on church property. This mask must be worn throughout Mass.
- The only entrance that will be used is the entrance via the Parish Center. This provides the largest parking lot with accessible entrances.
- Upon entering, please use hand sanitizer that is provided.
- Line up in the walkway, maintaining social distancing from those from other households. There are markers on the floor to assist you in maintaining social distance.
- Hospitality ministers will seat people in the church, providing for social distancing within the pews.
- Children must stay with their parents at all times.
- Once seated, please stay in your pew. There is no physical visiting allowed within the church.
- The music and prayers for Mass will continue to be provided in the bulletin. For larger households, we encourage you to print off additional copies of these pages for family members to use prior to coming to Mass. Bulletins will be provided, one per household, by the hospitality ministers. Please take the bulletin with you when leaving the church.

#### Mass:

- There will be no hand holding during the Our Father prayer.
- The Sign of Peace should be done through words and gesture, without touch to non-family members.

### **Distribution of Communion:**

- Only the Sacred Host will be distributed to the faithful.
- We ask that you only receive the host in your hand (not on the tongue).
- When coming forward, keep your mask in place until after you have received the host from the priest/Communion minister. Once it is received, step to the side, lower your mask, consume the host, and replace your mask before returning to your seat.
- There will be one Communion minister for each section of the church. The line for Communion should be single file. Hospitality ministers will assist you in maintaining social distancing.

### Dismissal:

- At the conclusion of Mass, please remain in your pew until directed by the hospitality minister to leave the church. Please maintain 6-foot social distancing from the people ahead of you leaving church.
- Please go directly to your car. There is no congregating within the church building, Parish Center, or in the parking lot.

### **Donations:**

- If you are not currently donating online, the Offering Boxes are located in the entrance area of the church and in the Atrium of the Parish Center. Please put your envelopes, checks, or cash donation in those boxes upon entering or leaving the Church. We will not be passing collection baskets.
- We will not be accepting food donations for the time being.

### **Physical Spaces**:

- The Children's Chapel (Cry Room) is closed until further notice.
- The bathroom in the church and one bathroom in the Parish Center will be open. These spaces will be cleaned after each Mass. Please limit their use as much as possible.
- There are no devotional candles, printed resources, hymnals, or extra furniture in the church, to reduce surfaces that need to be cleaned.
- Every other pew will be used. Pews not in use will be cordoned off.
- Holy water has been removed from the fonts.
- There is no Book of Intentions at this time. You are welcome to email the parish (<u>istcathe@dor.org</u>) with your prayer requests and we will continue to pray for them at Mass.

### St. Catherine's Is a Welcoming Community:

This will feel very different from your usual experience of liturgy at St. Catherine's. You won't be sitting in your normal spot, surrounded by familiar faces. You won't be able to go and say hello to those you haven't seen in a while. You won't be able to reach out your hands for the Our Father and the Sign of Peace. We will, however, be together again! You will be able to warmly greet those who will be sitting near you. You will be able to extend a Sign of Peace that expresses Christian love toward others. You will be able to help create a vibrant experience of Mass by your participation (albeit mask muffled) that will help us all engage in our liturgy with joy and enthusiasm. Families and communities have found new ways of



connecting in the midst of this pandemic, and we will find new ways of ensuring that St. Catherine's continues to be a welcoming community within these directives that will keep us safe. Let us also be sure to include, as best we can, a welcoming presence for those who, because of illness, risk, or caretaking duties, will remain within our online community for the time being.
