#### MEMORIAL OF ST. PETER CLAVER

This **Wednesday**, **September 9**, we celebrate the feast of St. Peter Claver, who ministered to the slaves arriving from Africa in what is modern-day Colombia in South America. He is the patron saint of African Americans and enslaved peoples. You are invited to join us for Mass that day (at 9 a.m.) in reparation for sins against the Sacred

Heart of Jesus and especially in reparation for sins based on race. Please also join us in a nine-day Novena asking God "to bring together in your love all whom hatred and racism have separated." The prayer is located on page 7.

#### From a letter by Saint Peter Claver, priest:

Yesterday, May 30, 1627, on the feast of the Most Holy Trinity, numerous blacks, brought from the rivers of Africa, disembarked from a large ship. Carrying two baskets of oranges, lemons, sweet biscuits, and I know not what else, we hurried toward them. . . . We had to force our way through the crowd until we reached the sick. Large numbers of the sick were lying on the wet ground or rather in puddles of mud. To prevent excessive dampness, someone had thought of building up a mound with a mixture of tiles and broken pieces of bricks. This, then, was their couch, a very uncomfortable one not only for that reason, but especially because they were naked, without any clothing to protect them.

We laid aside our cloaks, therefore, and brought from a warehouse whatever was handy to build a platform. In that way we covered a space to which we at last transferred the sick, by forcing a passage through bands of slaves. Then we divided the sick into two groups: one group my companion approached with an interpreter, while I addressed the other group. There were two blacks, nearer death than life, already cold, whose pulse could scarcely be detected. With the help of a tile we pulled some live coals together and placed them in the middle near the dying men. Into this fire we tossed aromatics. Of these we had two wallets full, and we used them all up on this occasion. Then, using our own cloaks, for they had nothing of this sort, and to ask the owners for others would have been a waste of words, we provided for them a smoke treatment, by which they seemed to recover their warmth and the breath of life. The joy in their eyes as they looked at us was something to see.

This was how we spoke to them, not with words but with our hands and our actions. And in fact, convinced as they were that they had been brought here to be eaten, any other language would have proved utterly useless. Then we sat, or rather knelt, beside them and bathed their faces and bodies with wine. We made every effort to encourage them with friendly gestures and displayed in their presence the emotions which somehow naturally tend to hearten the sick.



#### **ADULT FAITH FORMATION 2020–2021**

This year we will be continuing St. Catherine's tradition of providing faith formation for adults in a variety of ways – through Zoom, gathered classes, book discussions, faith sharing groups, leadership development opportunities, at-home resources, and more. We will be doing all of this through our Parish and Family Online Learning Playlists. When you register, you will gain access to a variety of activities and learning opportunities, including group activities, individual activities, service ideas, prayer resources, and more. The playlists will be released bimonthly (on the 1st and 15th of the month) beginning October 1, and will focus on a specific theme, such as Creation, the Mass, Sacraments, Saints, and so on. Those registered will be able to peruse the learning opportunities and choose what activities they would like to do. You can do as little or as much as you want, but we hope all adults will take advantage of some of what is offered. This playlist will also include ideas for children, youth, and families to do together, so it can be used with grandchildren and neighbors. The cost for our Online Learning Playlist is \$35. This is a one-time fee that will open up a year of adult faith formation ideas, programs, virtual gatherings, classes, and service programs. #### CHILDREN AND YOUTH FAITH FORMATION 2020-2021

Our Faith Formation year will begin on **October 1**, allowing us all to get into the new rhythm of life this fall. Our programs will look different this year in order to maintain safety amid COVID-19.

#### Children's Faith Formation, Ages 3-Grade 6

Families with children ages 3-grade 6 have three at-home options for Faith Formation this year:

- Option 1: Parish and Family Online Learning Playlists. When you register you will gain access to a virtual learning playlist. The playlist looks a lot like an online newsletter—but rather than articles, the learning playlist will contain a variety of activities and learning opportunities for different ages and learning styles, including activities geared for families to do together and for children to learn independently. The playlists will be released bimonthly and will focus on a specific theme, such as Creation, the Mass, Sacraments, Saints, etc. Those registered will be able to peruse the learning opportunities and choose what activities they would like to do. Families would choose at least three activities to complete over the two-week time span and will fill out a Google form at the end of the timeframe to let us know what activities were chosen. This is the faith formation format we are encouraging families to participate in.
- Option 2: Faith Curriculum. Some families may want to continue with the more traditional model of a faith curriculum where children complete a chapter each week using a student book and home lessons. The curriculum will be:
  - PreK 3–Kindergarten: We will use the *Allelu* curriculum through Our Sunday Visitor, which utilizes short home-based lessons that can be completed at the dinner table through conversations. There are also placemats for each lesson, which contain coloring sheets, activities, and reflection questions.
  - Grades 1–6: We will continue using *Be My Disciples* from RCL Benziger. Parents are welcome to request specific grade-level student books for their children to have at home. The children will then complete a chapter a week and go online to complete a review of the chapter.
- *Option 3: Hybrid.* If you would like to have the option of completing activities through the Online Learning Playlist as a family, and would also like to work on lessons with your child through a more traditional format, you can choose a hybrid of the first two options.

Regardless of which option you choose, having your child(ren) stay connected with our parish community will play an integral role this year. Even though Faith Formation will be conducted virtually, there will be gatherings for each grade level each month to catch up, review, read a story, or play a game.

#### Youth Ministry, Grades 7-12 (including Confirmation Preparation in Grades 7-8)

Middle and High School Youth Ministry will look similar to the way it has in the past—with the exception that we will be gathering virtually twice a month. MSYM will continue with Confirmation preparation and will use the *Chosen* curriculum from Ascension Press. This curriculum will still have us gather (virtually) and will use selected short videos and small groups to discuss *Chosen* topics. HSYM will also gather virtually twice a month and will be focusing on Catholic Social Teaching this year while using the book *Saints and Social Justice: A Guide to Changing the World* by Brandon Vogt to help drive discussion, insight, and passion for service in the world.

#### Registration and Cost

The cost for the year will be \$35 per family. This is a one-time fee that will open up a year of adult, family, youth, and child faith formation ideas, programs, virtual gatherings, classes, and service programs. If you have children who are seeking sacraments, or choose Option 2 (Faith Curriculum), there will be additional charges. So it is that we praise you, O Glorious Trinity, One God in Three Persons, united in one Divine Nature yet distinct in each Person – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Pour your love into our hearts, that we may speak the truth boldly and in a spirit of charity, and labor unceasingly for justice, peace and reconciliation in our divided nation and world. O Father, source of every blessing, O Son, Radiant Truth, O Spirit of Love, enable us to respect and love those who are different from ourselves and remove from our hearts, our homes, our Church, and our society every trace of racism.

Grant us, in your mercy, renewed and lasting resolve "to mend our ways, to encourage one another, to agree with one another, and to live in peace." (cf. 2 Cor 13:11) Grant us the wisdom to create a civilization of truth, justice and love, worthy of your Kingdom. 
