
Community Information

FROM THE BOOK OF ANN MARIE

Dear Parish Family,

This is the one-year anniversary of the pandemic from the perspective of St. Catherine's. We celebrated our last public Mass on Monday, March 16, after which Bishop Matano, following the directives of the New York Health Department, closed all our churches. St. Catherine's went 14 weeks with the church closed to public worship. For some of you, you haven't been back to the church since last March—a year without communal worship and without the Eucharist.

When we shut down the church, we had absolutely no idea that it would be closed for months, and even less of an idea that we would still be where we are a year later. Our Parish Center most often looks like those closed restaurants that used to be teeming with people but are now just empty vessels. It scares me, sometimes, to think of what it will look like when things are “back to normal.” Will I see you again in your normal pew on Saturday night or Sunday morning? Will children fill our Parish Center on Sunday mornings again? Will we find our way back into a feeling of community, or will a year and more apart make us strangers? Will we ever shake hands or hug again? What, as a Church, will we choose to do and what will we decide to let go of? Will your faith be stronger because of all you have been through, or weaker, or just different? What will my faith look like?

When I am done asking and worrying about these types of questions, I try to steady myself and remember that the Holy Spirit is really in charge, not me. I look to the many ways that I have seen your resilience and faithfulness. I take comfort in the ways we still connect and hold each other up. I trust in the Lord. Here are a few of the memories of this last year that lighten my soul:

- Watching the cars roll up for the Holy Week kit giveaway. It was the first time we got to see many of you after (only!) three weeks apart—and it was wonderful. We gave out more than 200 kits!
- Shortly after Easter, I sent out a survey to find out how you were doing. I had to relaunch the survey twice because over 230 people filled it out (and we could only collect 100 per launch!). Reading your responses was life-giving to me—helping me to know what was happening in your life.
- I love that the Prayer Shawl Ministry has knitted over Zoom, small Christian communities have grown strong over Zoom, adults have learned over Zoom, and children have shared over Zoom. Anything to reconnect and continue the relationships that are at the heart of our parish.
- Seeing all the “Alleluia” family pictures you posted on Facebook last Easter. It was awesome to see your faces and to proclaim ourselves as Alleluia people.
- My “How to Be an Antiracist” book group was one of 7 that met to read the book in response to the murder of George Floyd this summer. My particular group decided to continue to meet, and we launched our fourth book this week, *The Sum of Us*, as we continue to try to understand the experience of Black people in our world and our responsibilities for the systemic racism embedded into much of our society.
- As family after family has lost loved ones this past year, especially the recent loss of so many younger people, I have been heartened by the ways in which parishioners are reaching out to those who are grieving, doing their best to make the journey just a little easier.
- I love thinking back to sitting on my back deck listening to Jonathan Lunine's Science and Faith series this past summer, which was fantastic—in terms of both the number of people who attended (100!), and, more importantly, the content of the program.
- I am so glad that we have been a place of comfort to many of our parishioners who have recently moved away from Ithaca, only to find that they can still worship with us from wherever they now live.






Easter Flower Memorials
