FROM THE BOOK OF SHERRY SCANZA

Dear Parish Family,

Thank you for the music! For those who have been attending Mass in person or online since St. Catherine's opened last June, you know that, due to the risk of spreading the COVID virus through aerosol spray, we have not been singing at Mass, and Music Ministry members have been recording music for our liturgies. The music you heard for Holy Week and Easter was the culmination of many hours of time and energy spent learning music and recording, often working on two or three pieces at the same time. We hope that you were blessed by the Holy Week and Easter music, as we were blessed to share it and gratified to hear how it came together for the liturgies.

While never preferable to singing together in person, the recording process has allowed us to keep the music going. It has been an interesting and challenging journey for all of us – each week meeting for Zoom rehearsals with everyone muted (the lag time on Zoom creates a cacophony of sound which is not at all synchronous); working in isolation from one another; recording on phones, computers, and iPads in spare bedrooms, closets and basements; and learning how to save recordings in manageable formats and sending via email to our editing guru, Mary, who then “cleans” the files of extraneous noise and lines up the recordings so that the voices sound as if they are all in the same room. There is a bit of creative editing that helps the files line up, but what is being heard are the voices of our Music Ministry members, along with special friends who join us periodically.

Many of you have expressed thanks for the music and the effort put forth to make it happen. We appreciate your recognition of our efforts and pray that for as long as we are doing this, it will continue to be a blessing for all. However, we pray for the day that enough of us are vaccinated and the risk is low enough to allow us to come back together and praise God with all our voices in the same place!

A huge debt of gratitude is owed to everyone who joined in the process of making music for our Holy Week and Easter liturgies.
