preserve and strengthen them in their lifelong service of you.

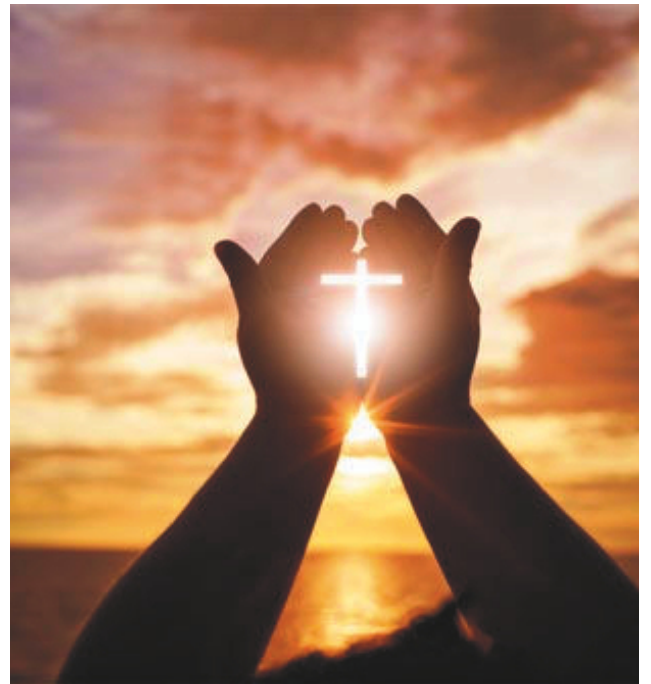
Open the hearts of your children

**FROM THE BOOK OF JOE**

Dear Parish Family,

This is the Week of Prayer for Vocations! There are several types of vocations that the Church recognizes: the primary vocation is a universal call to holiness. The three other vocations are marriage, the priesthood, and the consecrated life. The vocation and sacrament of marriage is defined as a covenant between one man and one woman. It is meant to be a sign and image to the world of the faithfulness, unity, and generativity of the Trinity – a reflection, if you will, of God active in the world. The vocation of priesthood is a call to service for the people of God. The consecrated life is when a person (male or female) gives themselves completely over to God, usually in the context of a religious community.

During the Week of Prayer for Vocations, the Church invites us to focus our attention and prayer on the vocation of the priesthood. That doesn't mean that we shouldn't pray for the other vocations; it just means that this vocation needs our attention. I don't think I have to inform you that there is a lack of ordained priests to serve the people of God in parts of our world today. It sometimes manifests itself in the merging or closing of churches and is cause for more than just concern. We need to be proactive in our plea for men to answer the call to the priesthood.

Earnestly praying to God for more men to answer the call to the priesthood is effective! We need to pray! We also need to ask young people if they have ever considered becoming a priest. When I told my parents that I was considering discerning the priesthood, the only thing they said was, "If doing this is going to make you happy, then we fully support you." Parents, let me assure you that my experience of the priesthood has been filled with joy. Yes, there is also sadness and sorrow, as there is in any human person's life, but the degree of joy that I have serving the people of God is overwhelming. My life is complete. So I encourage you to pray for vocations to the priesthood and have this discussion with your sons.

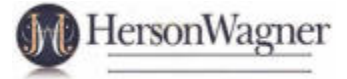
