

#### **UPDATE ON FOOD CABINETS PROJECT**

We are so grateful for the generosity shown by countless parishioners who have kept the Parish Center's food donation bin stocked in recent months! The majority of those items have gone into the blue food cabinets you might have seen around town—not just the one in from of St. Catherine's church, but also many others around Ithaca and Tompkins County. In particular, cabinets in Varna, Lansing, Etna, Freeville, and Enfield have been stocked with the *hundreds and hundreds* of pounds of items you've donated!

As winter continues, we have a few important reminders:

Please do not donate any expired food. Even if it's one day past the date! There are locations around town that will accept recently expired food, but expired food goes against Mutual Aid policies. Please understand that leaving bags of expired items poses unnecessary hardship on the volunteers who have to dispose of it.

Please, no metal or glass cans during wintertime. Most of the food cabinets are not temperature-controlled and we cannot accept metal/glass containers until next spring. There are, however, many similar options; for example, you could donate tuna fish pouches, microwavable soups, or Chef Boyardee meals that come in plastic tubs rather than metal cans.

You can donate non-food items, too! We welcome items such as diapers, personal care/hygiene items, small clothing items like socks/hats/gloves, and much more.




