#### St. Catherine's Ministries Need You!

As we continue to resume our normal activities here at St. Catherine's, we find ourselves in dire need of help with some of our most important ministries. Here are some ways that you can contribute your time and talent that would be incredibly helpful to our parish:

- <u>Collection counters</u>: Our collection counters come to the Parish Center on Monday mornings to count the offertory money collected during weekend Masses. Counters work in teams, with each counting session lasting just a few hours. The counters are on a rotating schedule so they only need to count approximately once or twice a month. Counters receive training, and a member of our finance department is there to help during counting sessions. Of course, our parish could not operate without the money received in the weekly collection, so this is a really important ministry!
- <u>Hospitality ministers</u>: Our hospitality ministers hand out bulletins, pass the collection baskets, and count the number of parishioners at weekend Masses, but they also do much more—they extend a warm greeting and a helping hand to all those who attend Mass. We would like to make sure that we have enough hospitality ministers for each weekend Mass.
- <u>Holy cleaners</u>: Our holy cleaners perform the very important task of cleaning the bathrooms after Masses, keeping our environment clean and inviting for all those who visit.
- Other liturgical ministers: We are always in need of liturgical ministers, including sacristans, commentators, lectors, and extraordinary ministers of Communion.

We will hold a brief training for hospitality ministers on Sunday, November 6, after the 11:30 a.m. Mass in the church. If you think you might like to join this ministry, or if you have been filling in as a hospitality minister but would like a little formal training, please come.

# ADDRESSING HUNGER IN AMERICA AND AROUND THE WORLD

This is a multibillion dollar piece of federal legislation that is reauthorized every five years. It funds SNAP ("food stamps") and many other national and global agricultural and antihunger efforts. Your voice is needed to ensure that Congress passes a Farm Bill that ensures fewer people go hungry and that farmers, especially farmers of color, can access the support they need to grow food for all of us. #### CIVILIZE IT: A BETTER KIND OF POLITICS

"Once more, I appeal for a renewed appreciation of politics as a 'lofty vocation' and one of the highest forms of charity, inasmuch as it seeks the common good." Francis, Fratelli Tutti). When Pope Francis refers to a better kind of politics, he means those activities through which we bring the light of our faith to the public square in order to further integral human development, solidarity, justice, and the common good. Participating in elections is an important form of political engagement, but just as important are ongoing activities such as involvement in city/town council or school board meetings; understanding what issues impact our neighborhoods, how poverty impacts our neighbors, and how public funds are used; and advocating for positive change. These are all examples of what Pope Francis describes as "political charity." Reflect: Take stock of your "political charity."




