CATHOLIC MINISTRIES APPEAL

So far, 69 parishioners have pledged a total of \$27,196 toward our parish's goal of \$60,000 for this year's Catholic Ministries Appeal (CMA). That's 45 percent of our goal. We are making great progress, but we still have more than halfway to go.

With the Diocese of Rochester's recent bankruptcy settlement, it's natural to wonder where the CMA money will be allocated. No CMA contributions will be used for the settlement. Instead, here is how the money raised will be distributed:

- Providing diocesan-wide services to our parishes and institutions: 35 percent
- Funding diocesan operations and support services: 29 percent
- Serving people in need through Catholic Charities: 10 percent
- Funding the ministries of our Pope and Bishop: 10 percent
- Supporting seminarians, deacons, and pastoral leaders: 7 percent
- Supporting the CMA campaign: 5 percent
- Educating our young in the Catholic faith: 4 percent

WE HAD A SYNOD. NOW WHAT?

In October 2021, this Synod called us to journey together to discover how we can become a more synodal church. What does that mean? According to the Synod glossary,

A synodal Church is a Church of participation and co-responsibility. In exercising synodality she is called to give expression to the participation of all, according to each one's calling, ministry and charism. Participation is based on the fact that all the faithful are qualified and called to serve each other through the gifts they have all received from the Holy Spirit. In the synodal Church the whole community, in the free and rich diversity of its members, is called together to pray, listen, analyse, dialogue, discern and offer advice on taking pastoral decisions which correspond as closely as possible to God's will.

In October 2022, the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops released the national synthesis, a result of ten months of listening throughout the Church in the United States. In eleven pages that include the sections "Enduring Wounds," "Enhancing Community Participation," "Ongoing Formation for Mission," and "Engaging Discernment," the synthesis attempts to give context to the common joys, hopes, and wounds expressed by Catholics in the United States. Earlier this year, we asked you to consider answers to several questions about the Catholic community and the Church. From the thoughts you shared in the pews and at the series of four synodal parish meetings, we noted common themes. It is now time to come together again and decide as a community what we will do.

You are invited to gather in community on Sunday, November 20, from 12:30-2 p.m. in Mahler Hall for a pizza lunch. Everyone is welcome to participate in small-group conversations around one of these or other topics that are important to you.

Are you wondering how to cope with family members not attending church? Struggling to explain your faith in 15 seconds? Interested in learning how to plan your own funeral? Fretting about the problems with Catholicism and the Church? Suspecting that science and reason have overcome religion? Feeling that female spirituality is missing? We hope you will join your pewmates and fellow Catholics to begin to get answers to the questions that matter to you.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED: SERVE WITH LOVE

Can you give of your time and talent to help our liturgical ministries here at St. Catherine's? We are in great need of:

- **Collection counters** to count the offertory money collected at weekend Masses.
- **Hospitality Ministers** to greet and help people arriving at Mass.
- **Holy cleaners** to keep the bathrooms clean after Masses.

The brief training is online and can be completed at home, or Rich Rasmussen can help you with the training at the Parish Center.

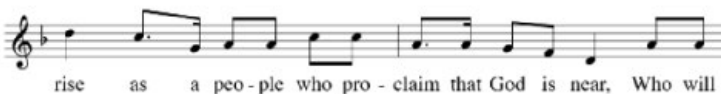
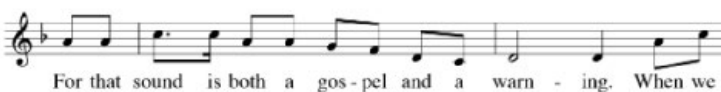
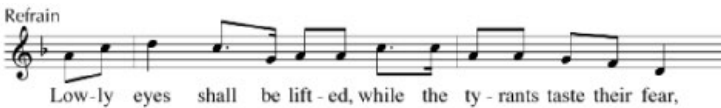
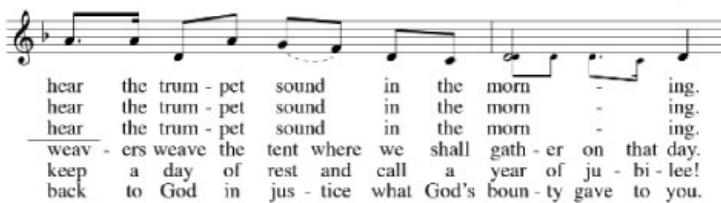
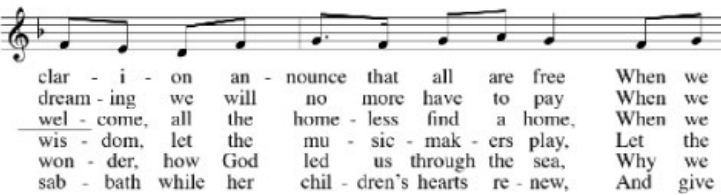
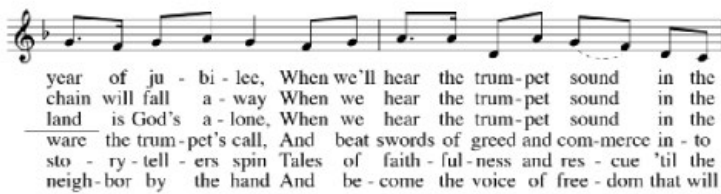
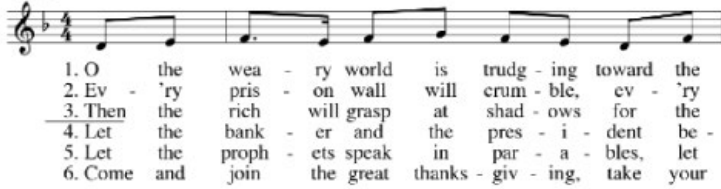
