


PASTORAL COUNCIL OPEN FORUM

THE PORTAL DE BELÉN

Every week in our prayers of intentions, we pray for the "sisters and the children of the Portal de Belén." What is this all about and who are those people?

The Portal de Belén is an elementary school in the town of Monte Plata, Dominican Republic. The school was created by the Missionary Sisters of Jesus in the mid-1990s.

The sisters were originally part of a congregation based in Argentina, which sent them to this poor community in the DR. After working there for a few years, the superior called them back to Argentina, but they refused! They had plans to build their ministry and wanted to keep serving the community they had gotten to know. So, they created their own community and were eventually recognized by the Vatican. The group now has a grand total of four sisters:

Sr. Teresa (73), the "mother superior," is originally from Spain. She trained as a teacher and helps to manage the school. All of the sisters work in diocesan ministries, and Teresa's role is in adult faith formation. She runs workshops and retreats, and for years she has written monthly guides for prayer and reflection that are used by the whole archdiocese. As part of her work, she trains other lay missionaries to run their own local prayer and service groups.

Sister Nilda (≈80) is originally from Puerto Rico. She works with the lay missionaries, organizes the church choir, and plays the guitar at the masses.

As her "day job," Nilda contributes to the diocesan health initiatives and runs the health clinic next door to the parish of St. Anthony. She schedules specialists to serve the very poor, charging them nominal fees, and her on-site pharmacy provides prescription and OTC medicines at very low cost. Her most recent challenge has been to find specialists who will volunteer their services once or twice a week. For example, right now she has a cardiologist and an oral surgeon, but the pediatrician retired and is no longer available.

- Sr. Nilda and others are now in the final stages of negotiating a plan to have the government subsidize such clinics in the region to make all services free. The government will also make available the specialists that the rural clinics might need. Nilda says that she'll have no problem meeting the government's conditions, because she is transparent and provides high-quality service.
- *Sr. Iris* (60), from Santo Domingo, is the principal of the elementary school. She does everything from curriculum planning to personnel management to accounting. Once a week she still goes to Santo Domingo to run errands and buy food to serve the kids at lunchtime. We'll describe the school and her work in a future issue.
- Sr. Ysabel (≈50) is from Bayaguana, a town in the province of Monte Plata. She finished a degree in management about five years ago and helps Iris with the school. Ysabel's specialty is youth ministry, so she runs the youth groups and retreats and helps the diocese with its programs for middle and high schoolers.

Parallel to all of this, the sisters are working on vocational outreach, in order to grow the community.

Stay tuned for an opportunity to meet them via a Zoom call later this semester.




