

#### HOLY LAND PILGRIMAGE

The itinerary for the parish pilgrimage to the Holy Land is set! The trip will take place from January 7-21, 2024, and will cost \$5,299 per person. #### SEND-OFF CELEBRATIONS FOR FR. JOE



Mark your calendar for these *four* opportunities to celebrate Fr. Joe:






