In 2019 Calvary Cemetery (managed by the Immaculate Conception Parish) began a project to procure and install a 96-niche columbarium for the above-ground interment of cremains (cremated ashes). That structure was built by a firm in Vermont , using 100 percent local granite, and was finally delivered to Calvary Cemetery last week. Landscaping is underway to complete a cremation garden, anchored by the new columbarium.

The Vatican approved cremation in 1963 and issued guidelines in 2016 for the proper and respectful handling of cremated ashes. Cremation has fast become a preferred end-of-life choice for many families, especially in our local area. Cremation, with interment in a columbarium, can be a cost effective, and perhaps ecological, alternative to in-ground burial.

Prices for a niche that holds two urns of ashes range from \$2,400 to \$2,800 depending on the location of the niche in the columbarium. A \$200 discount is offered for all niche purchases before September 30, 2023. A memorial name plaque is currently available for \$400, and the burial fee (open and sealing the niche) is currently \$200.




